on Saturday in Meeting Room No. 1 of the Recreation Centre. This clinic is sponsored by the Canadian Amateur Swimming Association and is co-ordinated by the Terrace Bay Recreation Committee. The clinic instructor will be Mr. Robert B. Eynon, Associate Professor of the Department of Athletics, University of Western Ontario. Mr. Eynon's qualifications rank him high in the field of competitive swimming. He was elected by Canadian Amateur Swimming Association as coach of the girls team for the 1967 pan-American games (Winnipeg, 1967) and was recipient of the First Canadian College Coach of the Year Award (1966) for all-round contribution to swimming and diving.

All persons interested in registering for this clinic should call at the Recreation Office. More particulars are available, and there will be a small registration fee.

Swimming Lessons - Swimming lessons will start on Tuesday morning, July 2nd. All persons who have registered for lessons can find out what time their class starts by checking the schedule posted on the window at the Swim Pool and on the bulletin board at the Recreation Centre.
