

Township Council met on July 23rd in the Municipal Office. Reeve W.E. Cavanaugh presided as Councillors present were R. Sinotte, D. Desrosiers and R. Bray. District Health Board member H. Coewas present to discuss Board Health Services.

Minutes of the last meeting were adopted as read and Recreation account amounting to \$8,767 were

passed for payment.

Correspondence included a letter from a local re resident asking why the television satellite station on Channel 11 goes off the air at 11 p.m. An inquiry was sent to the Department of Transport.

A letter from the North Western Ontario Municipal Association announced the name of the new secretary-treasurer and advised that dates of the next meeting are October 4th and 5th.

The Pee Wee Hockey Team wrote thanking Council for the jackets presented to them after their titlet

winning game.

It was decided that August 5th be proclaimed a Civic Holiday and notice to this effect published.

Council adopted a resolution to be sent to the Minister of Municipal Affairs which asks that local involvement be clearly defined to representatives of the township before proposed changeovers become effective.

The Greyhound Bus Company were contacted last December asking that better parcel-drop service be given to Terrace Bay. No reply has been received so the Secretary was instructed to write again. At the present time parcels are dropped off in Schreiber and notification of same is not always prompt.
