Mr. and Mrs. P. Testori have left to holiday in Duluth.

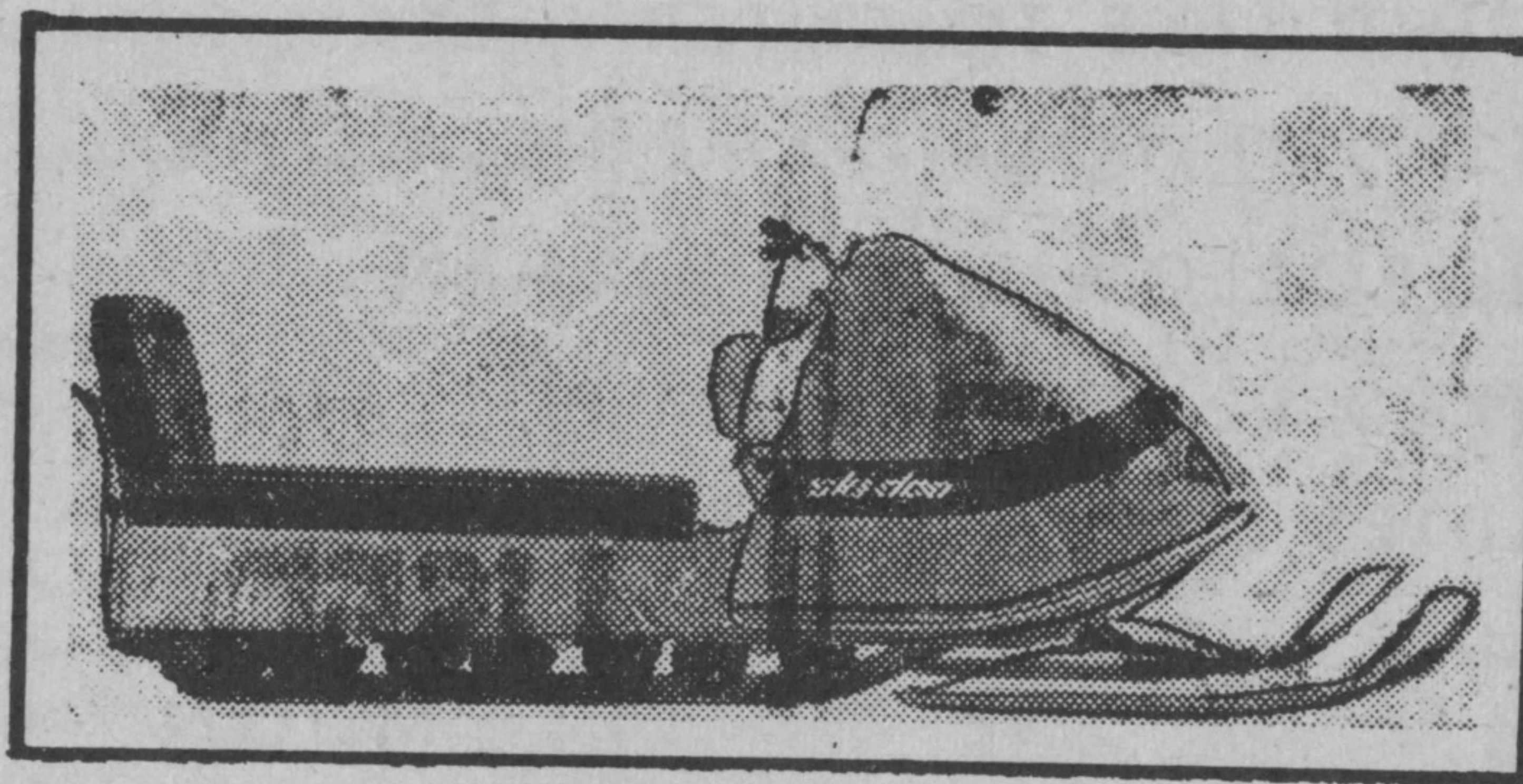
