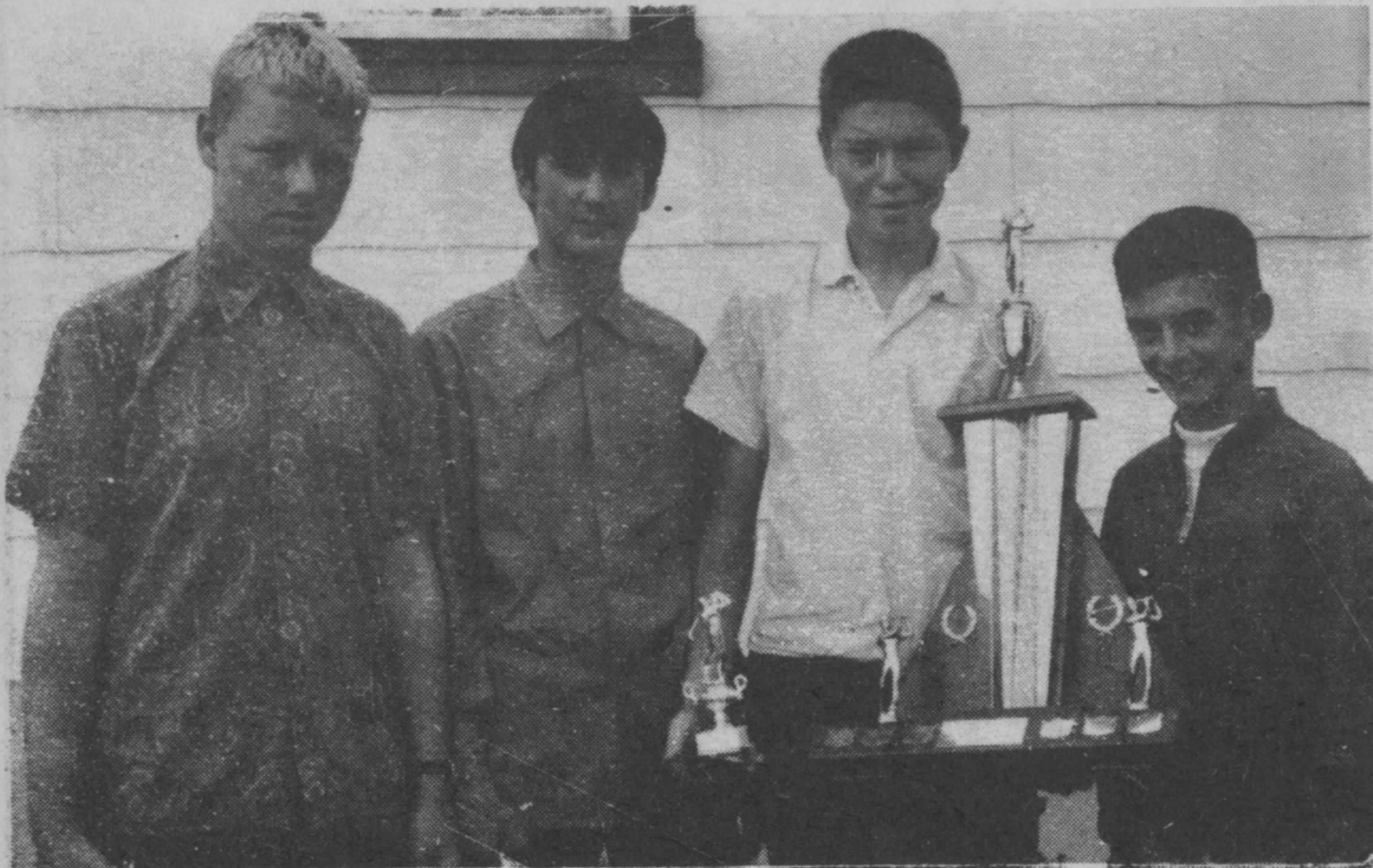
The Terrace Bay High School Board requested daily pick-up of garbage from the High School, since more students will be eating their lunches in the school at noon. This will be arranged by the town.
