COMPUTER TAKES OVER HOMEWORK FROM TEACHERS

Computers will soon relieve teachers of the chore of marking homework, writes William Morse in Design Engineering. Mathematics papers of 6,000 Stockholm pupils have already been corrected in this way. Next year it is hoped that 20,000 maths and 7,000 English papers will undergo the same electronic treatment. The students were given 32 problems to solve and had to choose the right answers from five alternatives. Their answers were then fed into computer which turned out to be just as capable as teachers in correcting and grading the problems. Plus the bonus factor of speed: the computer did the work of 1,000 teachers in a single hour.

"A CHURCH MANSE IS NOT ALWAYS A HOME"

A church manse is not always a "home", the 23rd General Council of The United Church of Canada learned today.

After studying manse problems, a committee concluded that whenever possible ministers should find their own housing, and pay their own rent.

In congregations where furnished houses are provided, the committee recommends that ministers should provide their own bedroom and living room furniture and personal touches. It also suggested business-like tenant-landlord agreements be signed to avoid misunderstandings over maintenance.

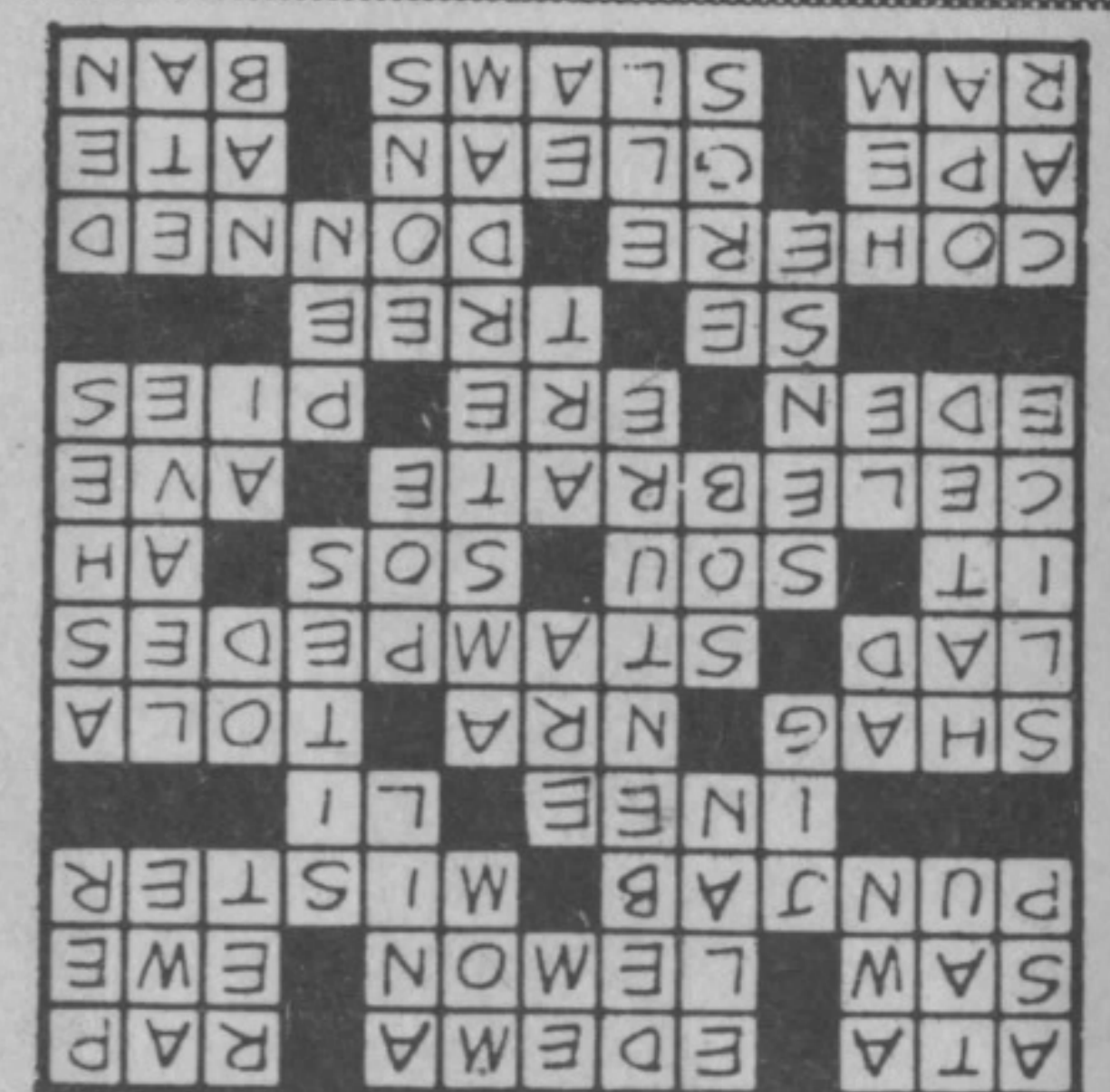
