WATCH OUT FOR THANKSGIVING TRAFFIC RUSH

And a lot of the driving will be done after dark, now that the days are getting short. Darkness brings special driving hazards. Last Thanksgiving holiday weekend, 17 of the 27 fatal accidents occurred after dark and another two at dusk. The Ontario Dept. of Transport advises motorists to slow down when the sun goes down. Stopping distance should never be greater than the distance in which you can see clearly. To avoid glare from approaching headlights, don't look directly at them. And, remember, it is courteous AND required by law to switch to low beams when meeting or following other cars.

parents to take an interest in their child's school and their child's education.

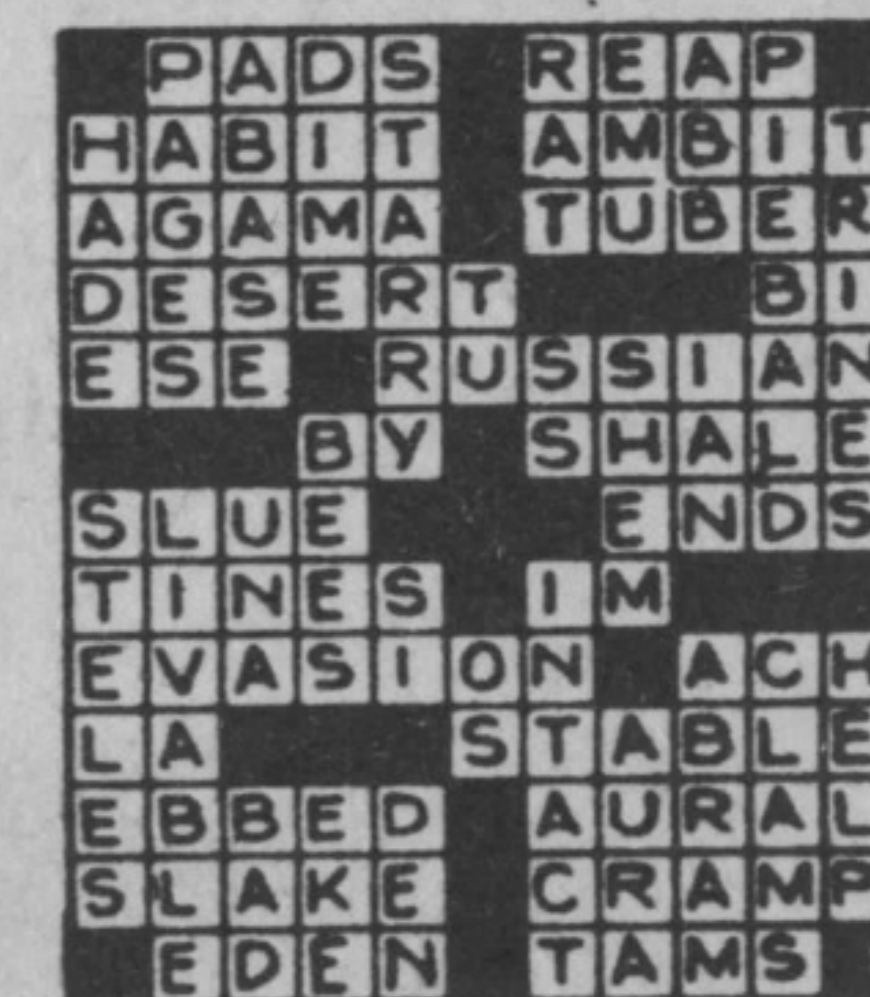
