(before it's too late)

When you are newly wed the "family" Hospital Insurance premium must be paid to cover husband and wife. If you belong to a group notify your group without delay or if you both pay premiums direct, notify H.I.R.B.

When you move to a new job you can keep insured by following the instructions on the Hospital Insurance "Certificate of Payment Form 104" that your present employer is required to give you on leaving.

When you turn 21 you are no longer covered by your parents' Hospital

Insurance. You must take out individual membership within 30 days. Get your application form at a bank, or a hospital, or from H.I.R.B.

When you have a new address notify your group. If you don't

belong to a group, write H.I.R.B.
