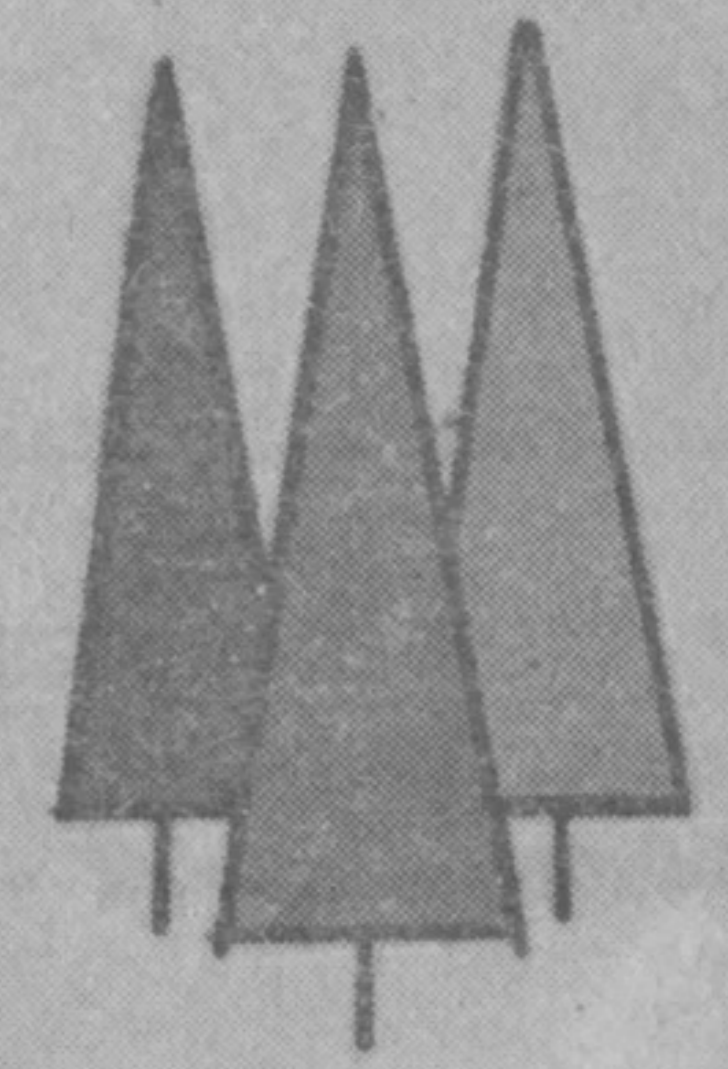

## THUNDER BAY ASSOCIATION MILL UNIONS
