two charges laid under the Liquor Control Act, convicted; one conviction; 15 investigations of complaints during the month. Assisted outside police force on two occasions; two cases of found property returned to owners; one door found open at night and owner notified; two transients assisted with meals and a place to sleep; one case of welfare required for 1 woman and 3 children. December - 2 car accidents investigated, one caused by ice, other hit in private parking lot; 3 charged under the Criminal Code and found guilty; one person sent to jail for six days; one person charged under By-law and found guilty. Seven charges laid under the Liquor Control Act were withdrawn at the request of the Crown Attorney; one charge laid under the Liquor Control Act and found guilty; two charges under the Juvenile Act, one guilty, one yet to be tried; one person missing from North Camp, later found in hospital in Port Arthur, missing report due to a misunderstanding; 21 complaints investigated during the month; one cat destroyed at owner's request; three parking tickets issued. During Christmas week, an all night patrol proved successful.

During the year, 97 Special Occasion Liquor Permits were issued to various clubs and halls in town; 1,551 quarts of Liquor, 111 bottles of wine, 1,408 cases of beer, with no trouble reported. The Recreation Centre, Public School and High School were broken into, all persons responsible arrested and charged. One store lost property by the thief reaching in through a broken window, and stealing coins. This case is still under investigation.

BUCK MATIOWSKY WINS H.L. CRAWFORD AWARD

**BRANDON (CP)**—Recreation director Buck Matowski of the city of Brandon has been named Western Manitoba's Sportsman of the Year and winner of the H. L. Crawford memorial award.

Matowski, 32, assumed his position a year ago and, since then, has organized an extensive recreation program in the city.

Runners-up were Keith Elder of Wawanesa, a pistol competitor in the last Olympics; Donna Hean of Brandon, defending Women's Five-Pin Bowling champion; Murray Zuk of Brandon, president of the Manitoba Baseball Association, and Stu Thompson of Brandon.

The award is named in honor of a former sports editor of the Brandon Sun.

Buck was director of recreation at Terrace Bay a few years ago before moving west. While at Terrace Bay he organized a highly-successful winter carnival, utilizing the talents of youngsters in the North Shore town.

When you are newly wed the "family" Hospital Insurance premium must be paid to cover husband and wife. If you belong to a group notify your group without delay or if you both pay premiums direct, notify H.I.R.B.

When you move to a new job you can keep insured by following the instructions on the Hospital Insurance "Certificate of Payment Form 104" that your present employer is required to give you on leaving.

When you turn 21 you are no longer covered by your parents' Hospital Insurance. You must take out individual membership within 30 days. Get your application form at a bank, or a hospital, or from H.I.R.B.

When you have a new address notify your group. If you don't belong to a group, write H.I.R.B.
