### CANADA'S (RAIL) WAY - from a U.S. newspaper

Canada is proving it. Trains can be better than ever.

With all the emphasis on airlines in current transportation news - from new Pacific routes to what appears to be regularly scheduled hijacking - it may have been overlooked that travel by rail is making a comeback in our neighbor to the north.

The Turbotrain - a streamlined dream with everything for passenger comfort from cars that are not flthy museum pieces to stewardesses, air conditioning and food - has gone into service between Toronto and Montreal.

A rocket on rails, the Turbotrain clicks off the 335 miles between the Dominion's two greatest cities in a minute short of four hours, a little more than twice the air time (not counting the nerve shattering delays getting to and from airports) and at a lower fare.

Hopefully, this is the shape of things to come in the United States. The projected American superfast train for the Washington - New York - Boston corridor continues to encounter delay after delay. But someday, before we all forget that a trip by train can be a pleasure rather than a 20th-century version of

purgatory, it just may, if not get off the ground, at least begin moving along it.

As you can see from the above editorial, Canada is sometimes referred to by our friends to the south, in a good light.
