CANADA'S (RAIL) WAY -from a U.S. newspaper

Canada is proving it. Trains can be better than ever.

With all the emphasis on airlines in current transportation news - from new Pacific routes to what appears to be regularly scheduled hijacking - it may have been overlooked that travel by rail is making a comeback in our neighbor to the north.

The Turbotrain - a streamlined dream with everything for passenger comfort from cars that are not flithy museum pieces to stewardesses, air conditioning and food - has gone into service between Toronto and Montreal.

A rocket on rails, the Turbotrain clicks off the 335 miles between the Dominion's two greatest cities in a minute short of four hours, a little more than twice the air time (not counting the nerve shattering delays getting to and from airports) and at a lower fare.

Hopefully, this is the shape of things to come in the United States. The projected American superfast train for the Washington - New York - Boston corridor continues to encounter delay after delay.
