Business arising - Reeve Cavanaugh discussed snow removal on Simcoe Plaza walks with the Chamber of Commerce. Correspondence - Council approved a request from St. Martin's Grade 8 pupils to hold a raffle to help with their proposed excursion at the year's end. A letter was received stating that there would be a meeting of the Thunder Bay District Municipal League on January 18th in Fort William.

Notification was received of a Dialogue on Regional Government at Quetico Centre.

A letter from Ontario Hydro Electric Power Commission in connection with possible strike was received.

District Health Unit stated that Mrs. Rena McAdam had been employed by the Unit as of January 1st, 1969 as Nurse.

The property wanted by N. Comisso for a Poultry Farm is not owned by the Township. Before consideration can be given to purchase of Crown Lands, more information regarding services must be approved by Council.

A \$25. donation was sent to St. John Ambulance Association.

Membership in the Ontario Mayors and Reeves Association was approved. Three representatives were authorized to attend the annual O.N.E.A. - A.N.E.V. Convention. A resolution was passed to purchase a new Police Cruiser from Spadoni Bros. Ltd. More strict control regarding Snow-mobiles travelling along Township roads will be enforced. Only insured operators may drive along roads, under present legislation. A further appointment to the Recreation Committee, completing the number for the year was Mr. W. Melnyk.

A notice of Managerial Grid to be held at Quetico Centre April 27 - May 2nd was discussed.

The Minister of Social and Family Services advised that W. Hanley was appointed as Administrator of Welfare for the Township.

The Township of Schreiber approved the appointment of H.J. Coe to the District Board of Health. Future appointments will be made on a 2 year basis, Alternately with Schreiber and Terrace Bay.

The Report for 1968 of the French Inspector was submitted.

A letter was sent to the Recreation Committee advising of the appointments of Mr. J. Cumming, Mr. F. Anderson, along with Councillors R. Bray and W. Farrell.
