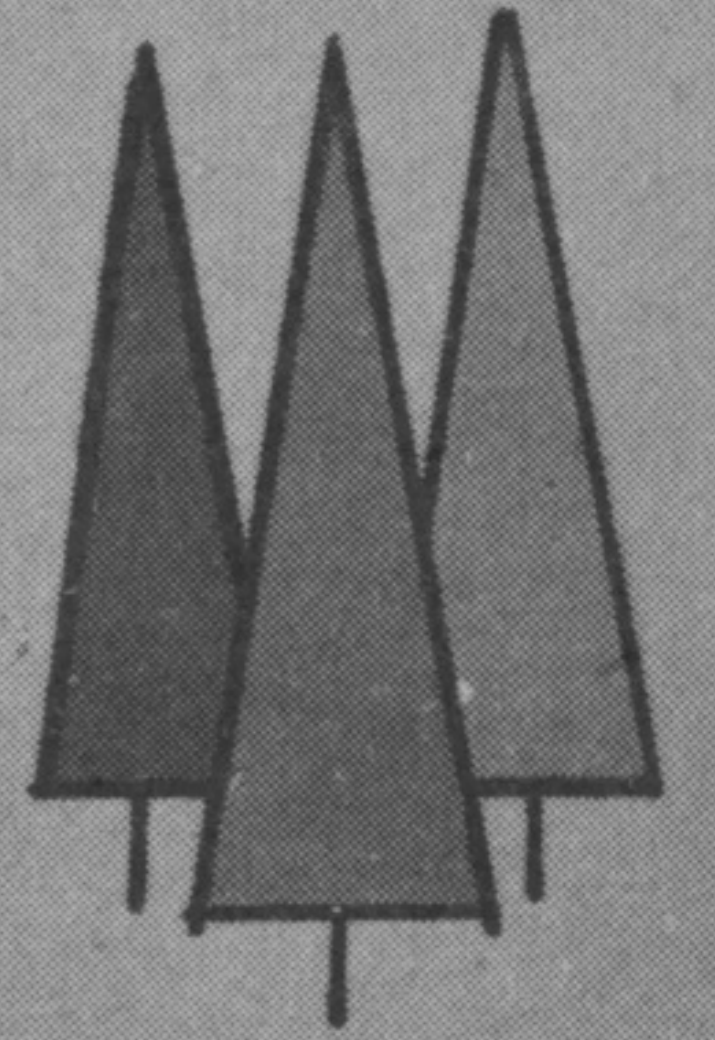

COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve Cavanaugh gave a brief report on his recent visit to Pinewood Court District Home for the Aged, at the regular Council meeting, held in Council Chambers.

Correspondence included a letter from the Manager of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, Mr. T. Scott, to the council, commending them for the hiring of snow removal crews to clean up the sidewalks on Simcoe Plaza, and assured them of his co-operation in keeping the area in front of the Bank cleared. North Western Water and Waste Conference will hold a meeting on April 18. John Mikus will be asked to attend.

The Terrace Bay High School will publish a Year Book, and asked Council to submit an advertisement. This will be done. In a letter to Mrs. G. Mullins Secretary Treasurer of the District Separate School Board was informed that levy of Separate School taxes will be handled by the Municipal Office.

Mr. Eric Opas, President of the Sea Cadet Corps, met with Bill Farrell to discuss the shooting range for the Sea Cadets, and informed him that a suitable site had been found outside the town limits.

Kimberly-Clark advised Council that a camp on Terrace Beach will be taken down by the company. A letter was dispatched to the Federal Government Department of Finance, Municipal Affairs, requesting an interim grant in lieu of taxes. The Department of the Attorney General stated there would be a training school for Firemen. Councillor Dave Desrosiers will look into this matter.

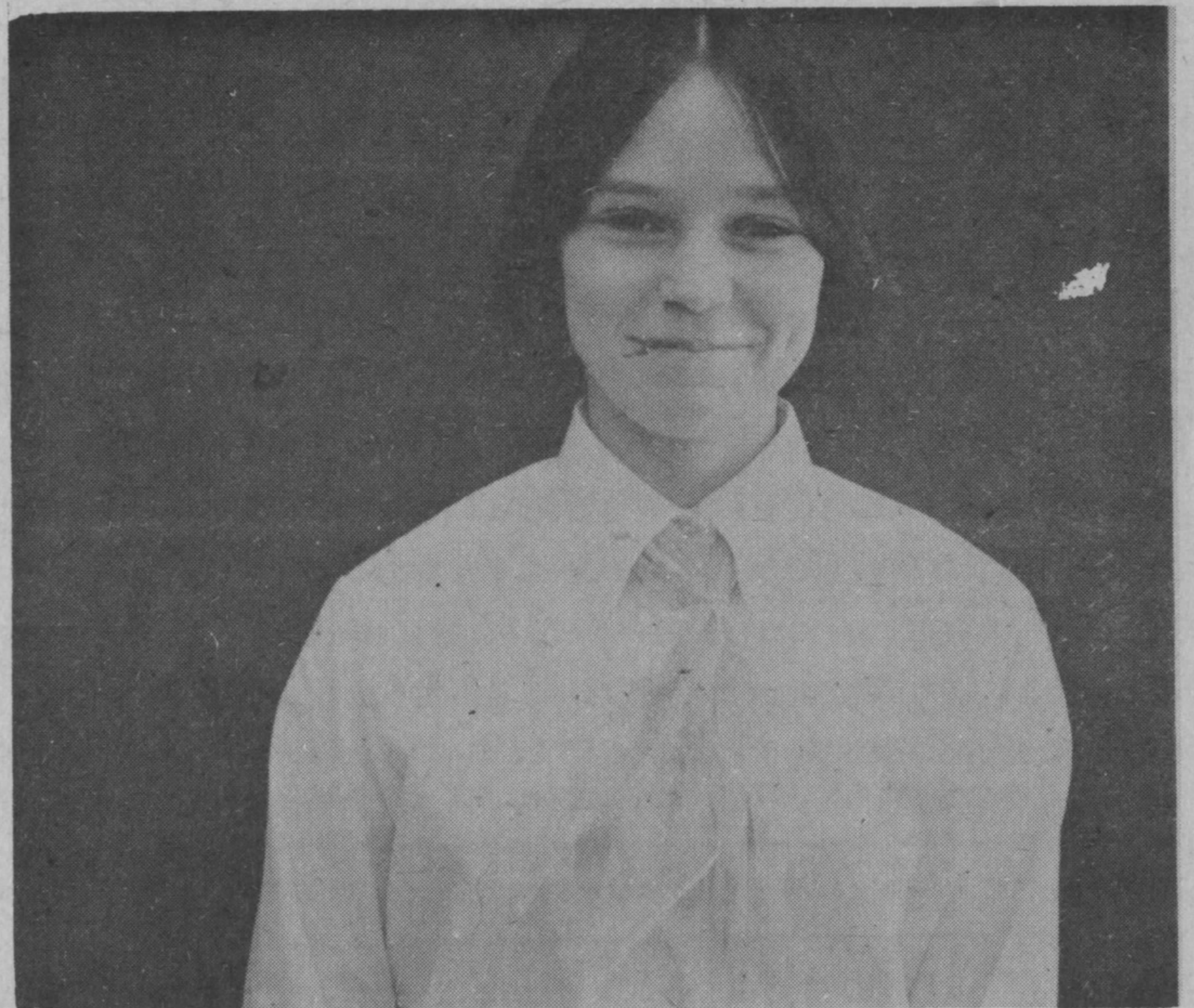
A letter was sent to the Lake Superior Divisional Board of Education, requesting arbitration in connection with the apportionment of costs for 1969.
