BURIED IN TERRACE BAY CEMETARY

Funeral services for Nick Bajkiewicz who passed away suddenly in the Terrace Bay private hospital on March 2nd, were held in the Community Church on Wednesday, March 5th, with Reverend G. Husser officiating.

Mr. Bajkiewicz, 54, was born in Poland, and came to Canada in 1947. He was employed by Kimberly Clark Co. for the past 19 years. He is survived by his wife, Cora, a son David, Michael and Chery, a sister Vera, of Grandview Manitoba, and a brother in Poland.

Many beautiful floral tributes were received, and the funeral was largely attended by friends from Schreiber and Terrace Bay, as well as many of Nick's co-workers at the mill.
