programes in Family Life and Sex Education in order for the implementation of these courses in their future teaching and that the Federation request the Department of Education to urge all county school boards of Ontario to initiate a programming in Family Life and Sex Education in K-13 as soon as possible under the supervision of properly trained personnel.

- 3That a resolution for this association to direct its influence on governmental authorities to obtain an extension of grants from grade iten to the end of secondary schooling within the R.C. Separate School system be accepted without action on it being taken until the brief to be presented in Early April by the Ontario Separate School Trustees' Association is finalized.
  - 4. That a resolution granting Ontario Separate School Boards immediate jurisdiction for an integrated program of learning from K-13 be handled as #3 above for the same reasons
  - 5. That the Unit Fee to the Federation be as follows: \$15.00 for a school of 200 pupils or less; \$20.00 for a school of 400 pupils or less; \$45.00 for a school of 600 pupils or less; \$60.00 for a school of 601 or more pupils. This replaces the 40¢ per member fee. Mr.
