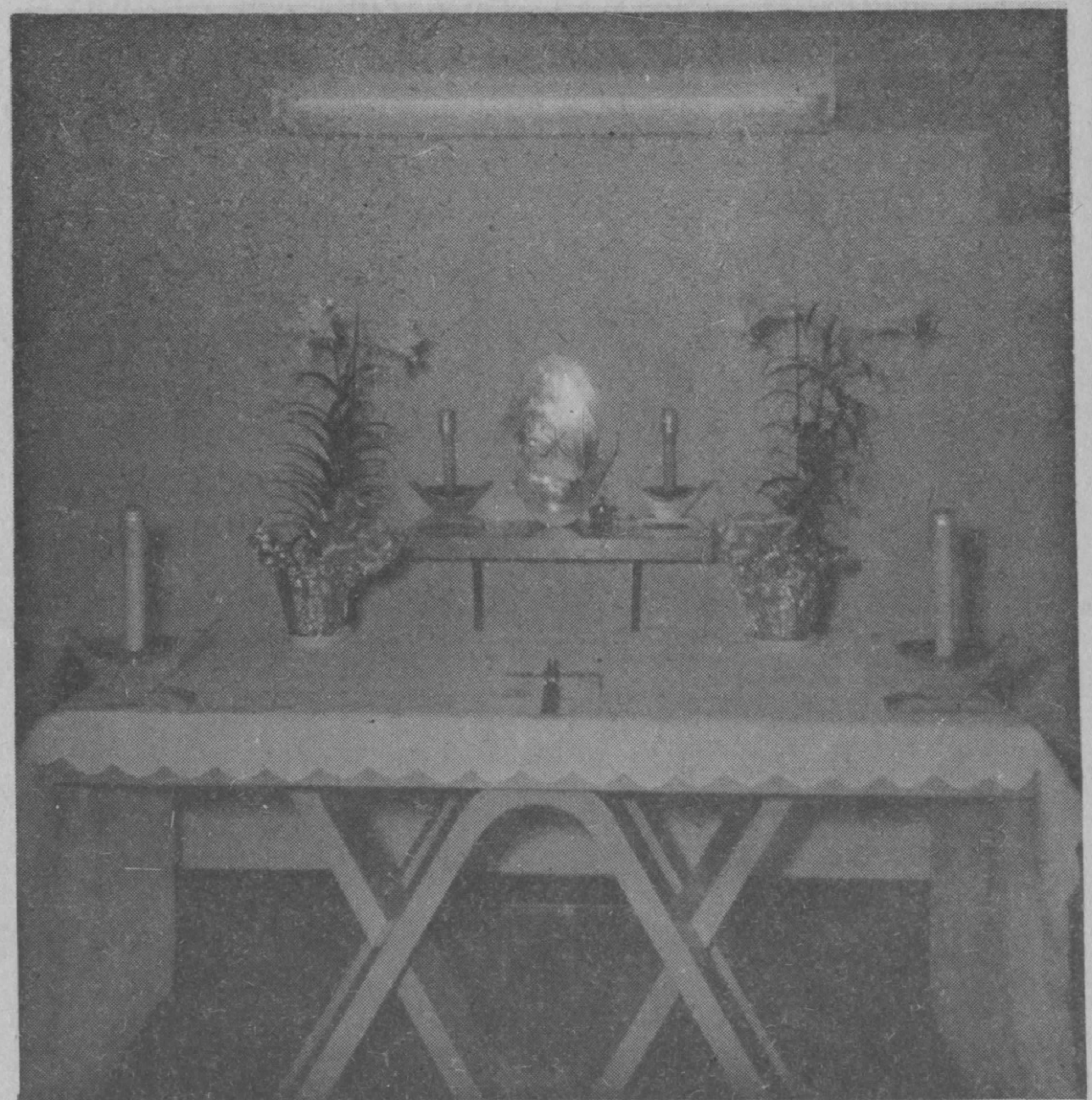
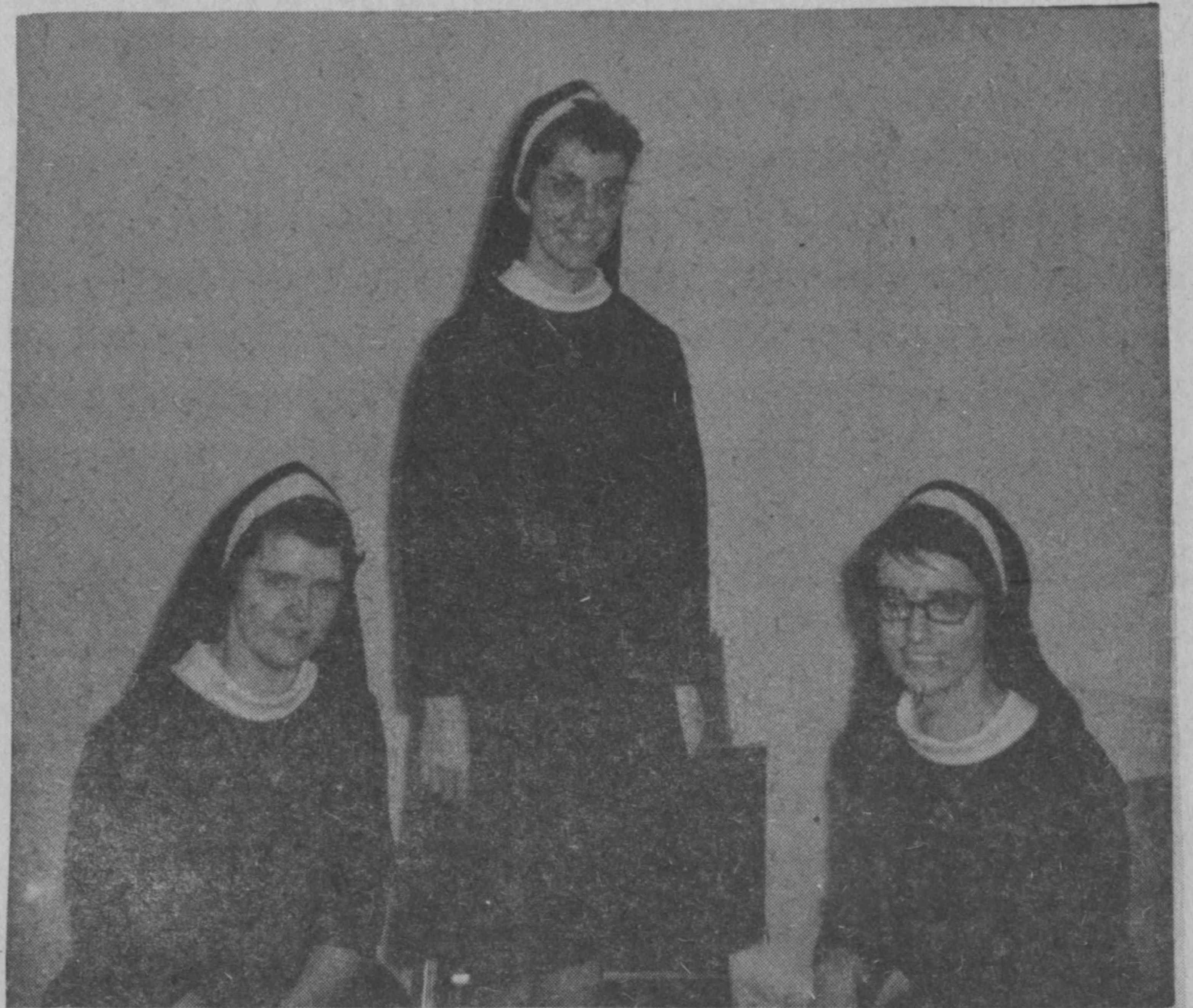
From the Music Room, through the house and beautiful Chapel, every inch of available space has been utilized to its best advantage.
