## C.G.I.T. PLAN WALKATHON

It is very re warding to learn of the keen interest in the walk, not only in Terrace Bay but also in Schreiber and Rossport. Some young boys have already completed a practice walk from Schreiber to Rossport. The original goal of the Walkathon was to give assistance to the Lakehead Department of Social Services, serving all denominations and also those with no Church affiliation. With the number of interested walkers, the Mission to the Lepers and other worthwhile causes will be included, according to the



amount of funds raised. All walkers must register before commencing to walk, producing written permission from the parents, if a child and receive a form to be signed at each check point, approximately every two miles. This is the proof of the number of miles walked.

The walk starts at 10 a.m., Saturday morning April 26th, from Terrace Bay Recreation Centre. Registration begins at 9.30 a.m. in the Craft Room
