SCHREIBER DETACHMENT O.P.P. PRESS RELEASE

During the past week, members of the detachment conducted several investigations involving complaint of trespassing, property damage and alleged theft. All matters were cleared satisfactorily. An investigation was also conducted regards the sighting of aircraft wreckage in an area north of Rossport, Ont. Through the assistance of the Ontario Hydro Construction Division and the utilization of their helicopter, the wreckage was proven to be that of a Superior Airways aircraft which crashed approximately 10 years ago.

It is most gratifying to report there were no accidents involving the motoring public during the

past week. May we again remind you to pay special heed to the possibility of encountering wildlife on the highways, particularly at this time of year. 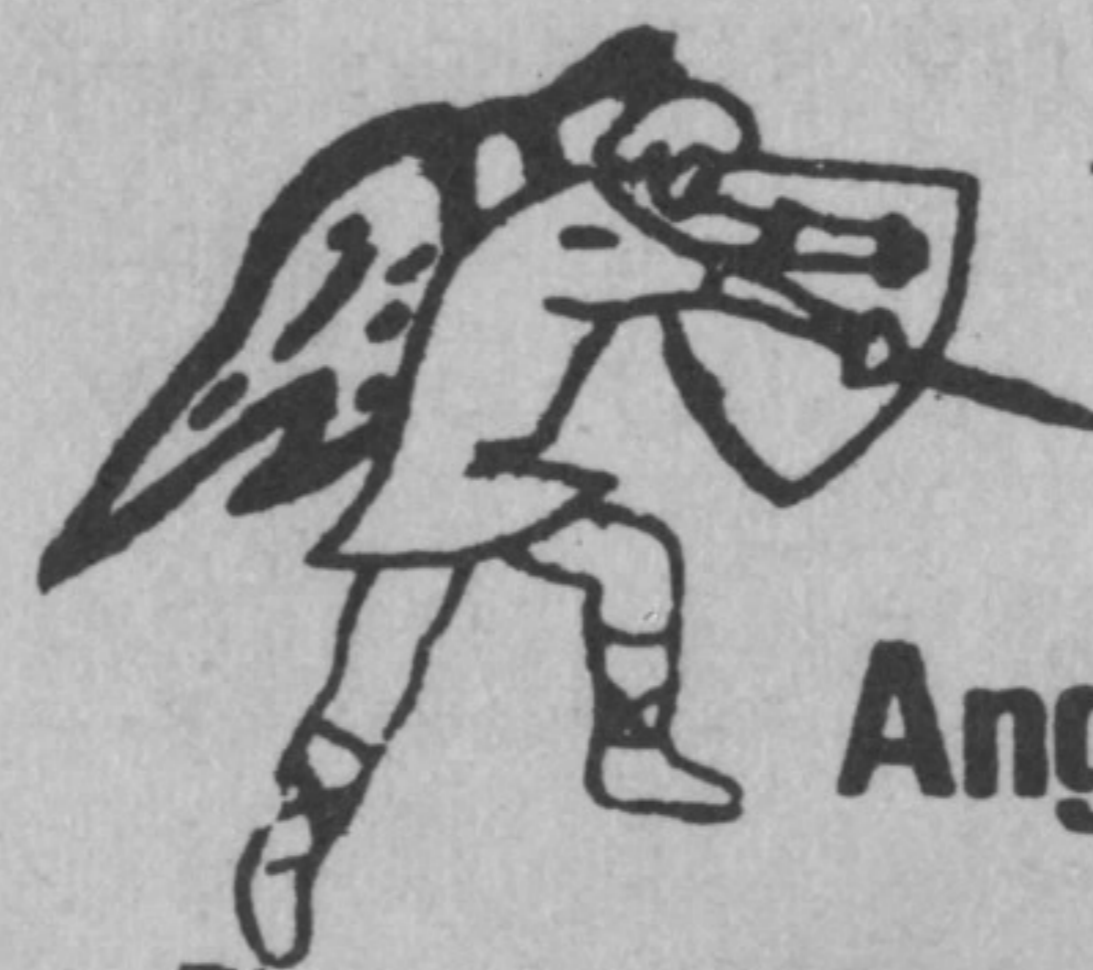
A missing and wanted person was apprehended in this area and returned to authorities at White River, Ontario.

One complaint of a driver being under the influence of alcohol operating a car between Terrace Bay and Schreiber, Highway 17, was made the subject of investigation. The driver was apprehended and charged with driving while his ability was impaired. This case has been remanded to June 3, 1969 at Schreiber Provincial Court.

Several complaints of false telephone reports of fire were received from the local Fire Department. These matters are still under investigation.

A total of ten charges were laid against motorists for various driving infractions, in addition there were seven motorists given warnings. Members of the Detachment patrolled 3,748 miles of highway and investigated 3 motor vehicle accidents with property damage approximately \$1000.00. Injuries were sustained in one accident, requiring one person being hospitalized. Initial cause of the accident was a Moose on the roadway.
