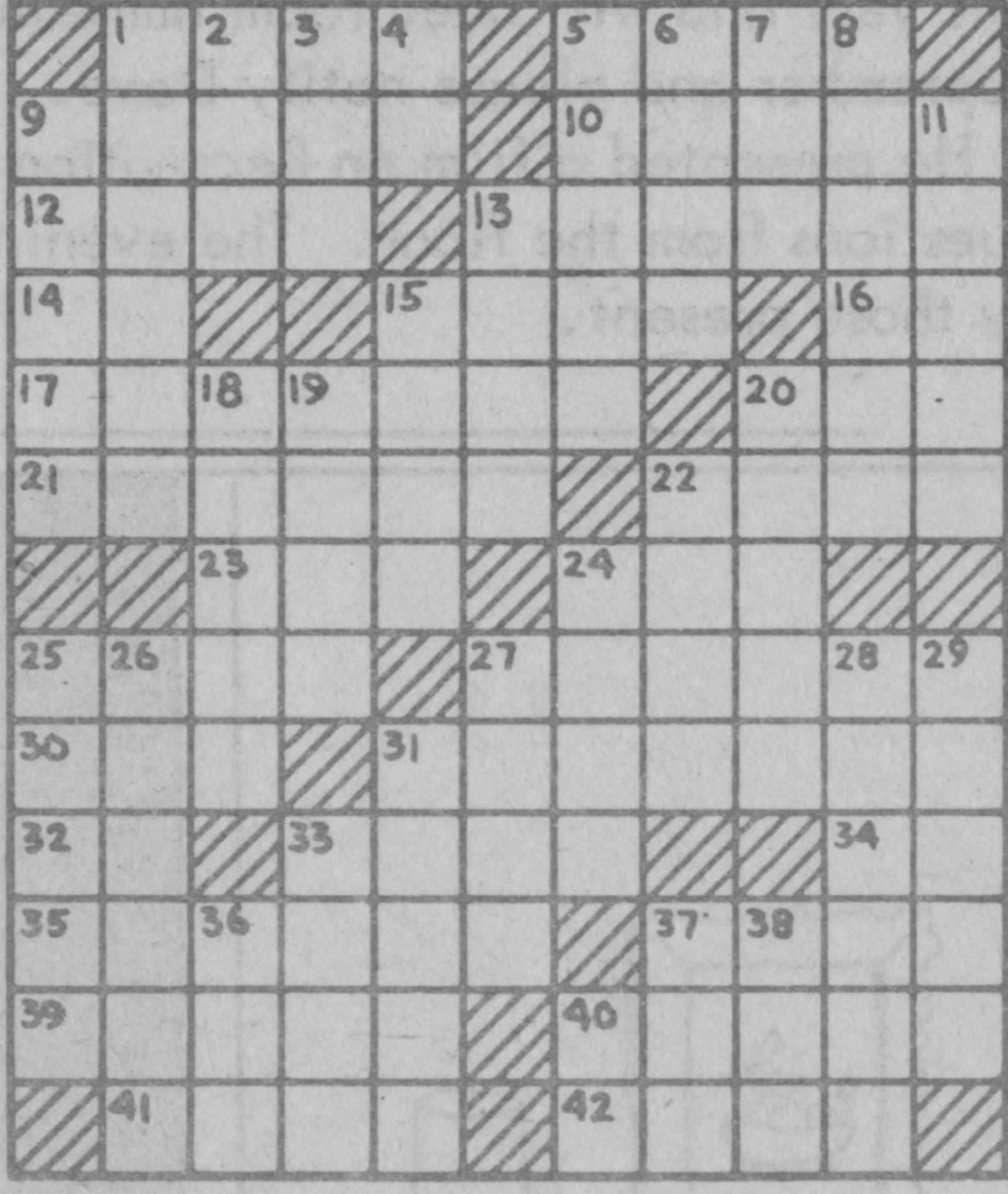

DISTRICT COURT NEWS

In less than half an hour Judge T. Connors handled Tuesday's docket: Kenneth G. Perry of Marathon forfeited \$12.50 on a charge under section 82 (3) of the Liquor Control Act - having liquor under 21 years of age; Bob Long of Terrace Bay also \$12.50 for having liquor in a place other than a residence; Thomas Long of Terrace Bay \$12.50 on a charge of unnecessary noise (squealing tires) section 42 (3) HTA:

Emile Comeau was a bigger loser when it cost him \$22.50 for driving a car with out a license and \$52.50 on a charge under section 3 (1) MVAC Act - driving without insurance. Steven Fedorak of Terrace Bay was remanded on three charges under the Highway Traffic Act until July 15th.
