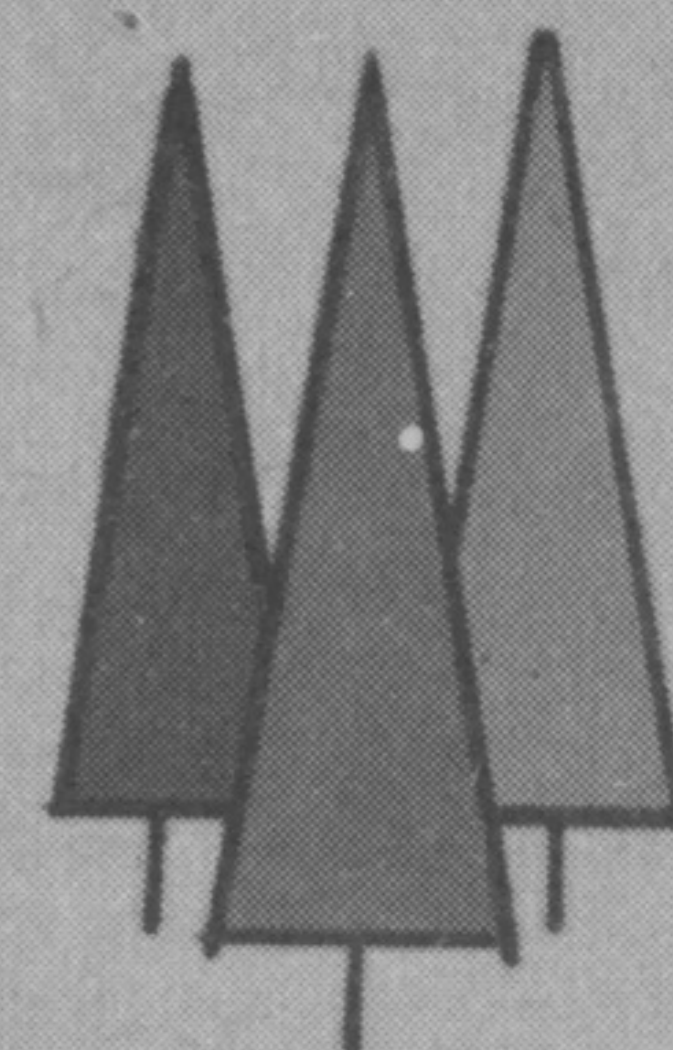


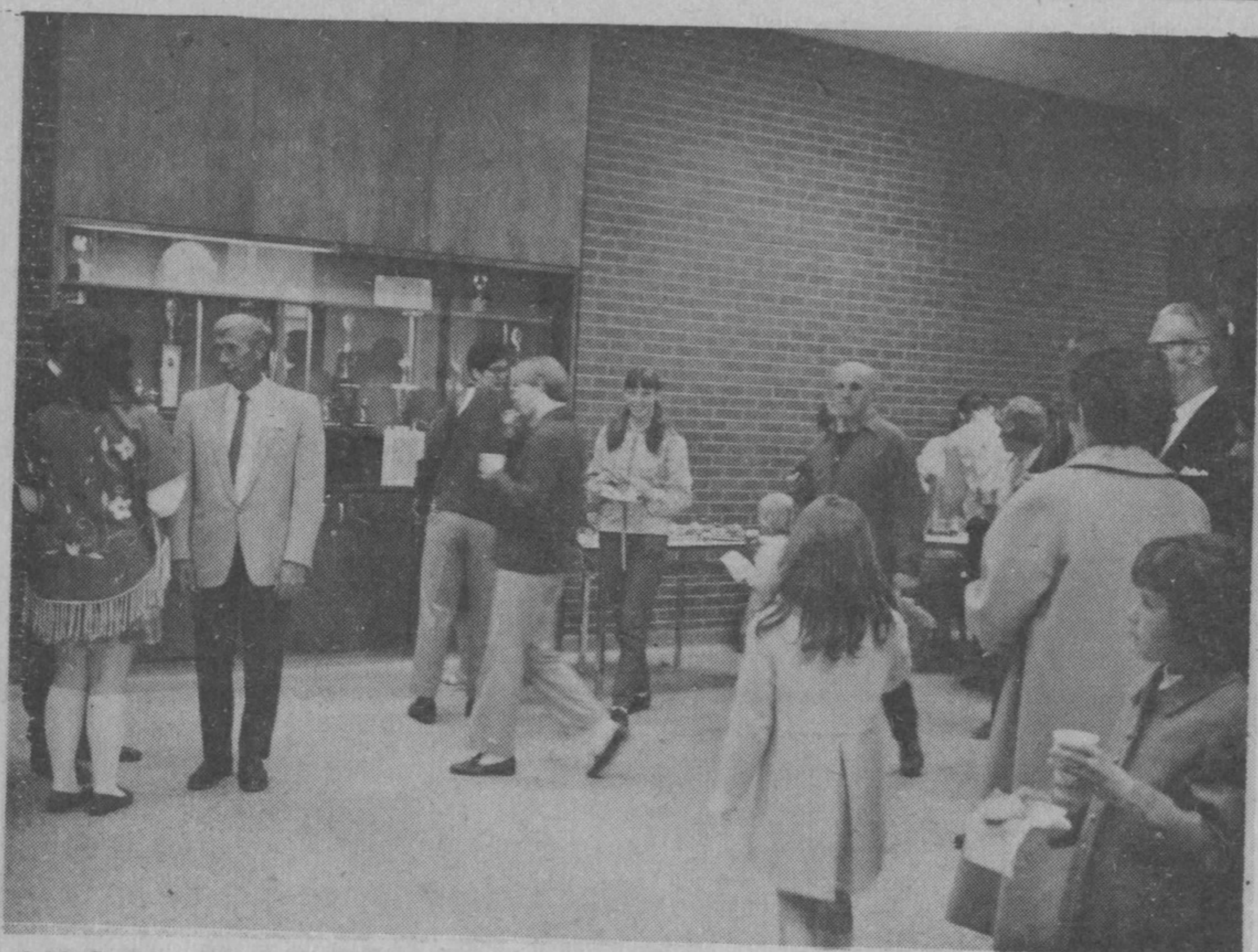

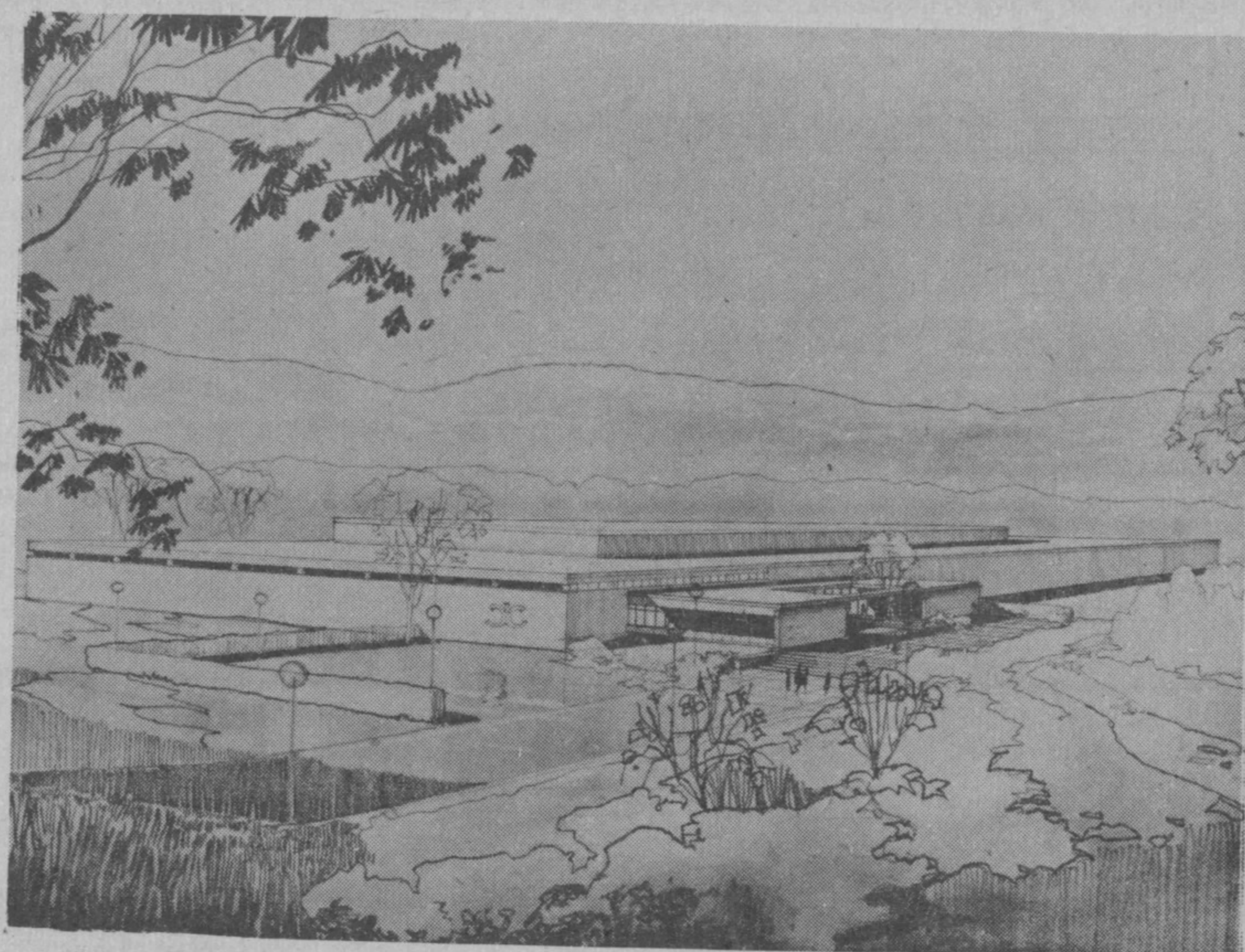
HIGH SCHOOL HOLDS OPEN HOUSE

KLEENEX TISSUE MILL TO BE BUILT

Huntsville June 10th -

G.L. Carruthers, President of Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited and associated companies announced here today that the Company plans to build a large Kleenex tissue mill adjacent to the Town of Huntsville in the Muskoka region.

Huntsville is located about 135 miles north of Toronto. The mill will be built on a 300 acre parcel of land in Chaffey Township. It will be the Company's largest tissue plant in Canada and will produce tissue for use in the full range of the Company's sanitary products, particularly in the production of Kleenex facial tissues, Kleenex towels and Delsey Bathroom tissue.

Estimate cost of the mill is excess of \$20 million.

It will employ approximately 90 persons, most of whom will be drawn from the surrounding area.

Site preparations will commence by September 1 of this year and the mill will be ready for start-up
