At the last meeting held by the Anglican Church Women before the summer recess, Mrs. David Harrison who is leaving Schreiber was presented

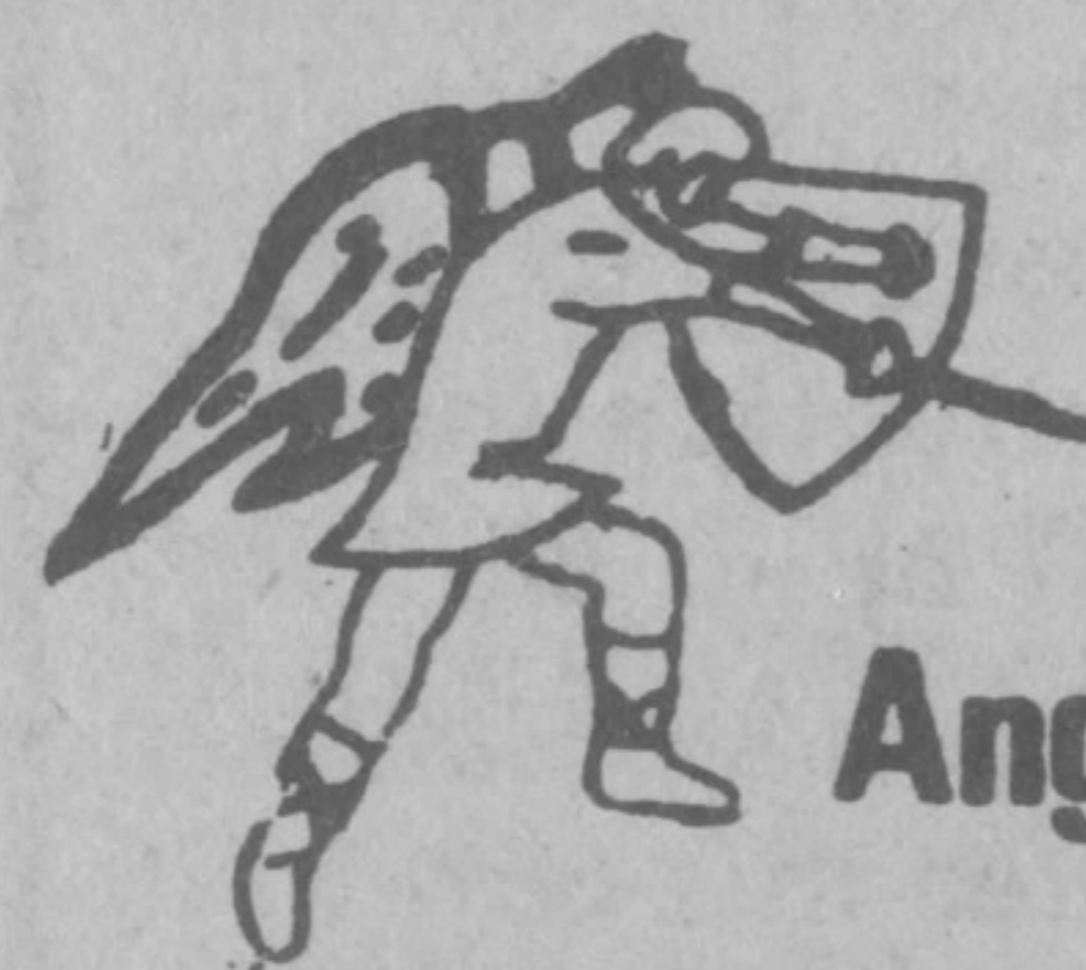
with a gift of appreciation by the Women for her work in the church. Mrs. Harrison is shown with Mrs. Cyril Sparkes, right, who made the presentation.
