8 years Cathy Mulligan; boys, Lawrence McParland; 9 years: Barbara Huard; boys Rainer Wirtz.

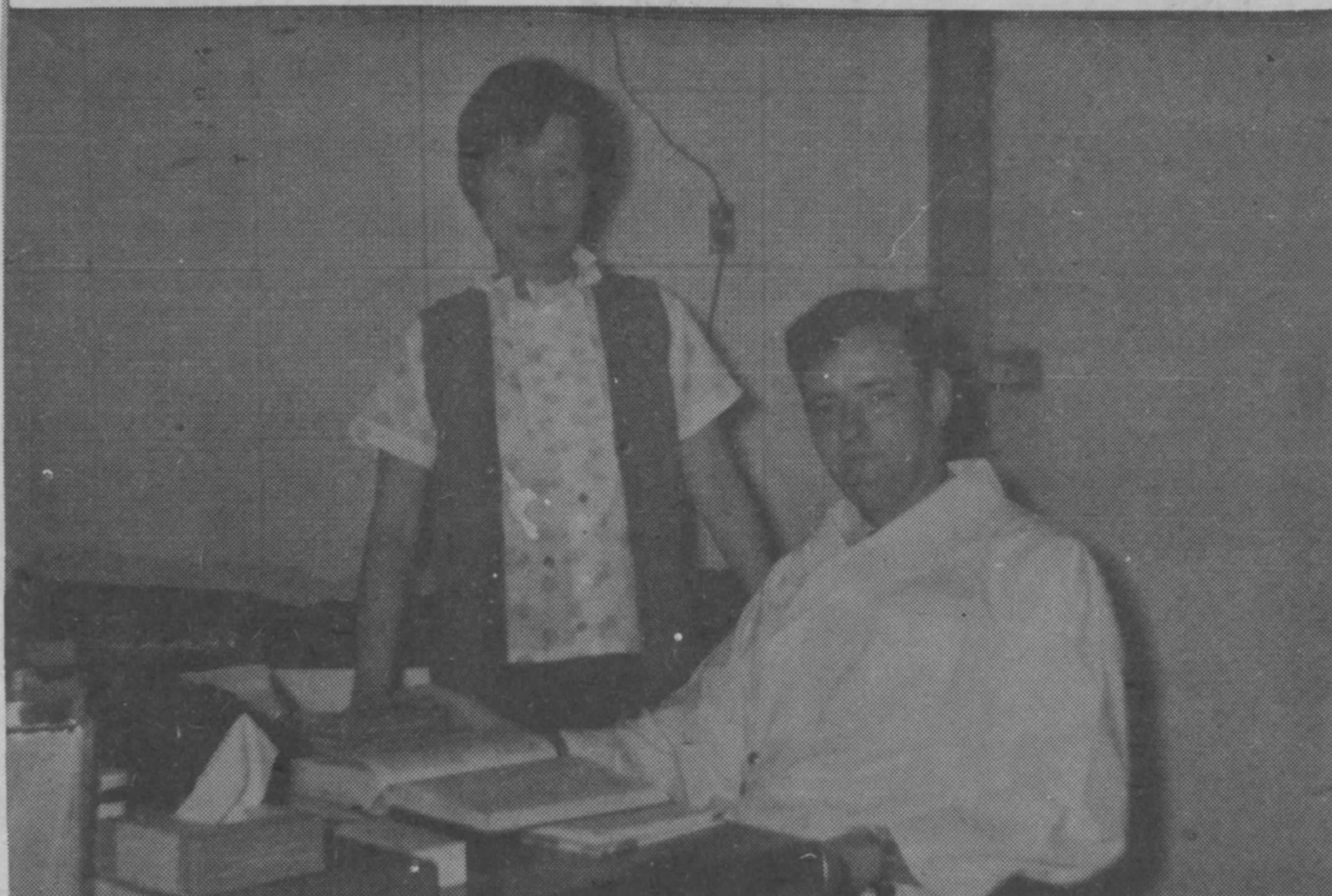
10 years Louise Morin; boys Bob Smilsky.
