them in the hands of the forger. **PERSONAL CHEQUES** - Thefts from the mail before delivery are increasing. Street letter boxes are being uprooted and stolen intact: they are being opened with forged keys right on location.

Once in possession of your mailed cheque, the forger fraudulently uses your signature and bank account number to defraud banks and businesses.

Simple precautions will help in controlling this type of crime:

1. When possible, deposit your mail at your local post office, or
2. Deposit your mail in a street letter box just before final collection times.
3. Keep a record of cheques issued and have your bank account made up regularly.
4. Report discrepancies immediately.

### STOP - WHEN RED SIGNAL LIGHTS FLASH
