Union will be in Montreal for the three-day Confer ence, September 22 - 24. They will be discussing next year's collective bargaining plan, organization and merger and a new political and social action program.

"We must broaden our concerns as trade unionists and work together with other organizations to protect the social and economic inequities of our nation," said L.H. Lorrain, Canadian Director of the 40,000 members of the International Union in Canada, in announcing Mr. Calder's visit to the Conference.

Mr. Calder who represents the Northern British Columbia riding of Atlin has the distinction of being the only Canadian Native Indian ever to sit as an elected member of the Legislative Assemby of British Columbia.

He was first elected to the Legislature in 1949, held office until 1956 and was elected again in 1960 and has held office ever since, being re-elected on the NDP ticket in last month's provincial elections.

Mr. Calder is the founder and president of the powerful Nishga Tribal Council organization and is provincial organizer of the Native Brotherhood of British Columbia.
