Investigations over the past week have included - three liquor investigations which resulted in three minors being charged with "Minor Obtaining"; an investigation was conducted regarding two subjects registering under false names at a local motel. These subjects have been charged under the Criminal Code; two reports of thefts of property valued at more than \$50.00 and two reports of thefts of property valued at less than \$50.00, which are still under investigation; four reports of "Wilful Damage" and all are still being investigated; one break, enter and theft at a local shop was reported - this is also still under investigation.

On the Traffic Scene there were two motor vehicle collisions which resulted in property damage valued at approximately \$1,050.00

There were four charges laid under the Highway Traffic Act and three warnings were issued for minor infractions and defective equipment.
