

THEATRE COMPANY VISITS HIGH SCHOOLS

High School students in Schreiber and Terrace Bay were fortunate to have their school included in the itinerary of the Theatre Hour Company.

Travelling by bus and using their own stage in the high school gymnasium, the six artists presented five excerpts from the Twenty Centuries of Comedy. Italian comedy "Pantalone Punished" from the sixteenth century; and English comedy "The Rivals" by Sheridan from the 18th century; a Russian comedy "The Marriage Proposal" by Anton Chekhov from the 19th century and the contemporary French comedy "The Bald Saprano" by Eugene Ionesco, written in 1950. NEW TREATMENT FOR BIRTHMARKS
