of Revenue and Expenditures up to the end of October. It would appear that by exercising extreme care the expenditures for the year will not exceed the budget.

It was learned that on October 22nd and 23rd Mrs. Deol and members of the Association for the Mentally Retarded had taken the children from the school for Trainable Retarded in Marathon to the city of Thunder Bay. While there the children visited the Airport, Twinhaven School, Shaw's Baker, the Television Station, Planetarium and Chippawa Park. Mrs. Deol commented that the field trip was most rewarding to the children.

It was decided to engage a firm of architects, Smith, Carter Parkin, of Thunder Bay, in preparation for the proposed addition to the Schreiber Public School. It was planned to have the teachers and principal of the school become involved in the planning for this addition.

Mr. H. Rutetzki of Manitowadge was duly elected as Trustee to complete the remaining term of office of Mrs. Marilyn Beacon who resigned recently.

An inquiry has been sent to the members of the Staff-Board Relations Committee regarding a proposed meeting at an early date.

Vocal music will be reintroduced into the curriculum at the Alexander Public School in January of 1970 with the engagement of a well qualified teacher, Mrs. Jane Wirtz.

Mr. Don Szmon will replace Mrs. Marilyn Beacon as a member of the Advisory Committee for the Trainable Retarded.

Miss Sandra Kragero, a native of Schreiber, presently teaching in Thunder Bay, has been engaged to replace Mrs. Anna Lee Gordon who is resigning from the staff of the Heron Bay Public School at the end of December.

Mr. G.R. Saumur has been nominated for a two year term as a teacher in schools in Europe operated by the Department of National Defence.

Policy was set regarding the use of school premises outside of school hours. The community is encouraged to use school facilities in the evenings and on weekends. The problem of supervision was discussed at length and it was decided that if the group using the facilities can offer supervision by responsible adults which is considered to be adequate by the Board, it is not absolutely necessary to have a Board Custodian in attendance. Rates will vary from community to community.

Considerable discussion took place regarding finances for the operation of the schools for the remaining part of 1969. It was learned that, although two letters had been written by the Hon. W. Darcy McKeough, Minister of Municipal Affairs, to Mr. J.G. Palmer, Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Improvement District of Marathon, requesting that Marathon's outstanding account with the Lake Superior Board of Education be paid without further delay, no monies had been received to date from the Improvement District of Marathon by the Lake Superior Board of Education. Because of this the Board is now faced with major financing through the banks in order to continue the operation of its schools.

The Board was notified that the Ontario Paper Company will be moving from the Heron Bay area in the summer of 1970. Accordingly two rooms of the Heron Bay School will remain open next fall to accommodate grades one to six and that grade seven and eight pupils will be transported to Marathon for their education.

A meeting is to be arranged in Rossport to discuss the future of the Rossport Public School with the local residents.

A problem facing the Board will arise when bilingual classes from the Separate School in Manitowadge graduate to the High School. The Director is to investigate and report on this matter at an early date.

The Director of Education is to look into the matter of the hiring of a Maintenance Supervisor for the division.

A general discussion on Educational problems followed. Every attempt will be made to introduce drafting as a subject in the Terrace Bay High School. The main problem in connection with this is the limited accommodation available.

Several comments were made regarding a report written by Mr. A.J. Campbell, Learning Materials Program Consultant, regarding resource centres (libraries) in the elementary schools in this division. This report was quite comprehensive and pointed out that there is a great deal to be done to bring the resource centres in the elementary schools up to a standard considered satisfactory. Trustees were in agreement that every effort will be made to correct the situation in as short a time as possible.

A committee of four Trustees was appointed to work closely with the principals and Director in the preparation of the budget for 1970.

The next meeting of the Lake Superior Board of Education will take place on Monday, December 8th, at 7.00 p.m. in the Marathon High School.

7) If you have been drinking moderately allow one hour for each one-ounce drink or beer (12 ounces) consumed, before driving.

8) Keep the car in good operating condition, especially brakes, tires, steering and front end suspension, front and rear lights, mirrors, turn signals, wipers, muffler and exhaust pipe.

9) Always fasten safety belts and lock car doors.

10) Drive defensively "Recognize the hazard; understand the defence; act in time."
