WATER FEES TOPIC OF MEETING

An executive meeting of the Rossport Water Association was held Wednesday evening with a full attendance. Albert Rouble was appointed chairman. A motion was passed that the chairman and secretary approach a water subscriber who thinks that he does not have to pay water fees because he put his own line in from the main line and considers himself a private owner. If such was the case all subscribers could claim the same as all have their own line connected up to the main water line.
