On November 13, 1969, The Honourable W. Ross MacDonald, Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, did on behalf of Her Majesty's Government of the Province of Ontario, present a "Tipstaff" to Commissioner E.H. Silk, as his official symbol of authority.

The ceremony took place in the Lieutenant Governor's Suite before an assembly of 225 guests. Prime Minister John P. Robarts, Chief Justice G.A. Gate, Justice Minister A.A. Wishart, distinguished guests, Commissioned Officers and wives of the Ontario Provincial Police.
