CREDIT FACTS (From Consumers' Assoc. of Canada With the increased use of credit by consumers, the need for information on individuals applying for credit is understandable.


Currently outstanding consumer credit in Canada totals more than 48 million and the extension of credit is not an automatic privilege--about 50 percent of applications for cash loans are refused.

In return for the granting of credit, one must expect c certain amount of reasonable scrutiny of what most people consider their own private business. This usually is the function of a credit reporting agency, or credit bureau. There are two types of credit fact-gathering agencies. The first compiles files and operates on the basis of exchange of information between creditgrantors. It may supplement its information from press clippings to complete the file. The other major group is that of the "investigating " agency. The main distinction is that these bureaus investigate much more actively, by telephone or personal interview, individual case histories referred to them by clients. Several agencies include both operations.
