

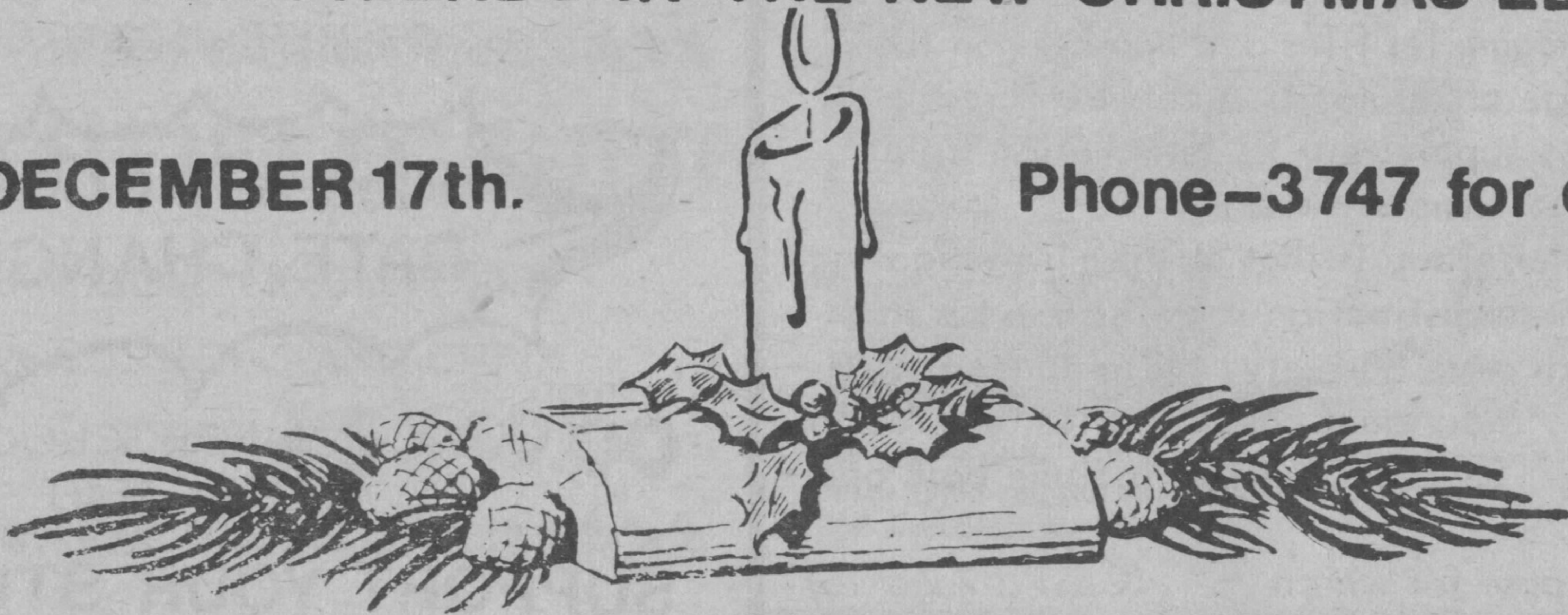

information is sought from credit bureaus is the assessment of applications for credit, but enquiries from intending employers, insurance companies and companies dealing in the bonding business are frequent.

By and large, bureaus strive earnestly for accuracy and fairness but mistakes can and do occur. When this happens, the results can range from mild inconvenience to serious damage to reputation.

As a result of many consumer complaints directed to the Consumers' Association of Canada, CAC approached the federal government to request legislation to protect the individual consumer from inaccurate and erroneous information being included in files without their knowledge. CAC believes that consumers should be able to see without difficulty their credit rating files and to arrange for correction of untrue items which have been worked into the file.
