The Ladies Northwestern Club Playdowns will take place this Friday at 7 P.M. in the curling club -

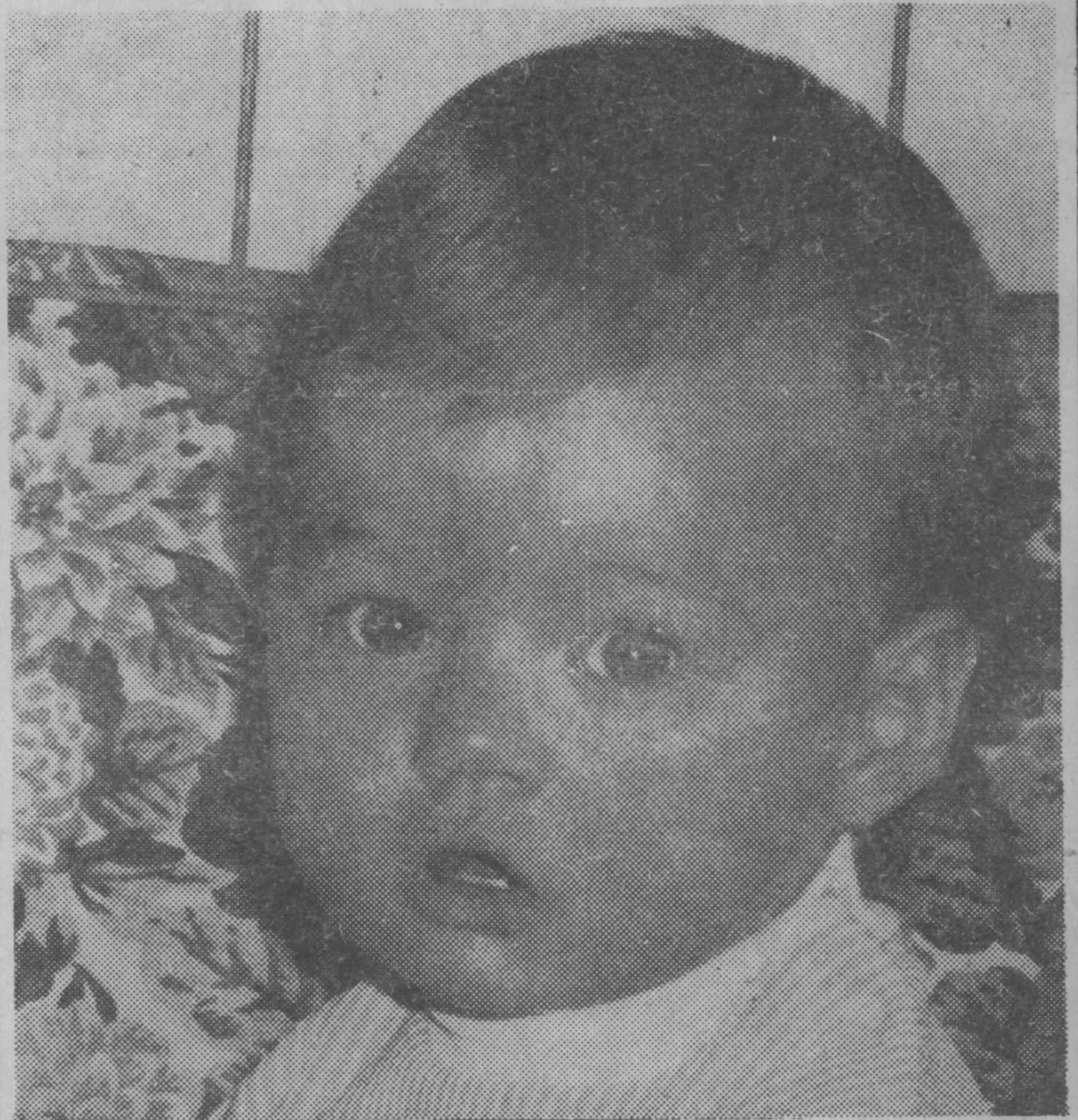
1st draw - Second draw will be held Saturday at 7 P.M.
