As everyone in town knows, there are only two places where the citizens may go to have a cup of coffee - the Snack Bar in the Recreation Centre and the Voyageur Restaurant. Both places have certain rules which we MUST follow in order to buy their commodities. For example, at the Voyageur Restaurant there is a rule stating that everyone, excepting adults, must pay a cover charge of at least twenty-five cents in order to sit at a table. When we asked the manager whom he considered an adult he promptly replied "Anyone over forty-five". We don't feel it is necessary to point out how ridiculous this statement is.
