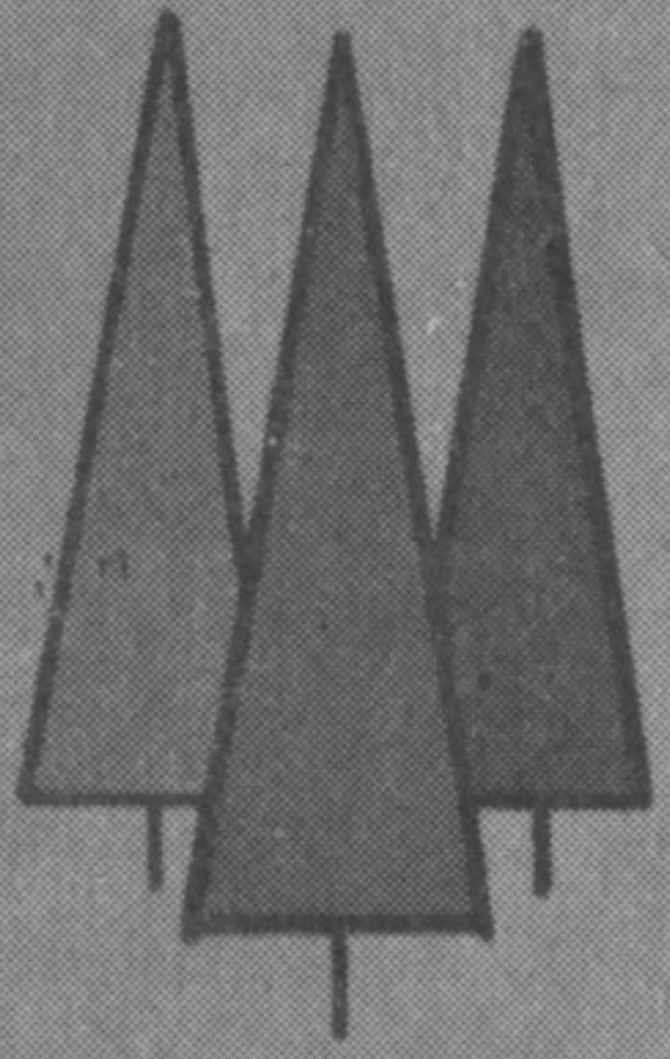
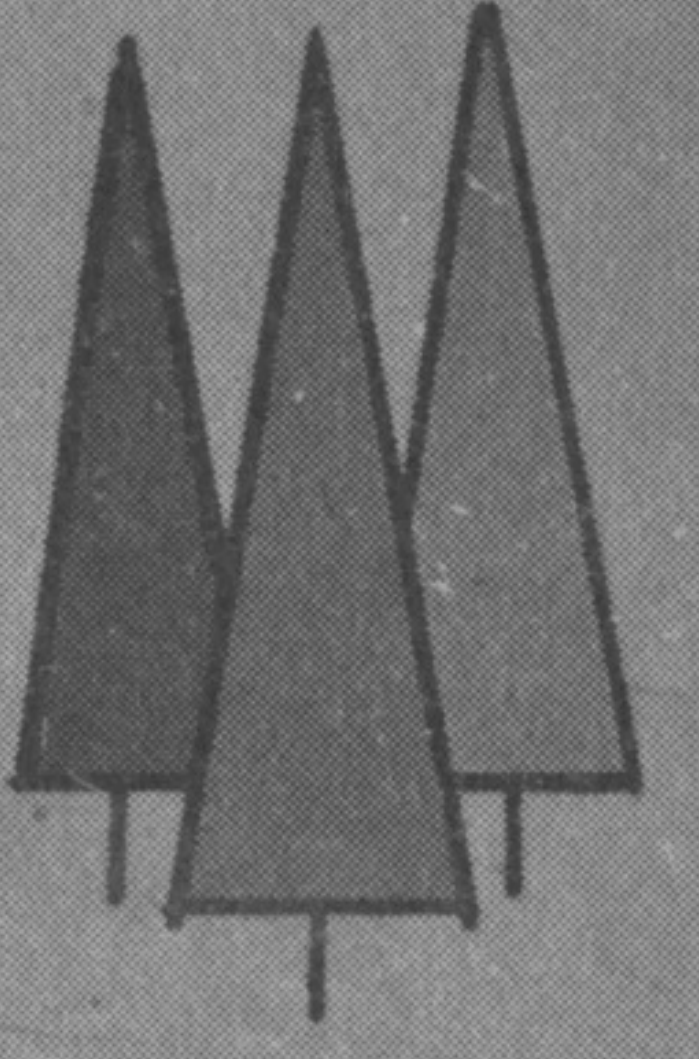

RESIDENTS BUILD SKATING RINK



A new outdoor skating rink has been opened in Terrace Bay, in the Lakeview - Superior area. The idea first came from the Recreation Committee, since there is already a skating rink in the Poplar Crescent - Hudson Drive playground.

The area for the rink was cleared by Kimberly Clark Pulp & Paper Co. and the rink was built and is maintained by residents in that area.

The new rink is bigger than that on Poplar Crescent and the area in which it is situated (on one of our "Terraces"), is, now that it has been cleared, an ideal site for future park and recreational development. At present a toboggan slide is also on the site and, like Poplar Crescent, the rink is flood-lit so that it can be used in the evenings.

It is indeed a pleasant sight to see children and adults enjoying the facilities at these outdoor recreation areas both day time and evenings.
