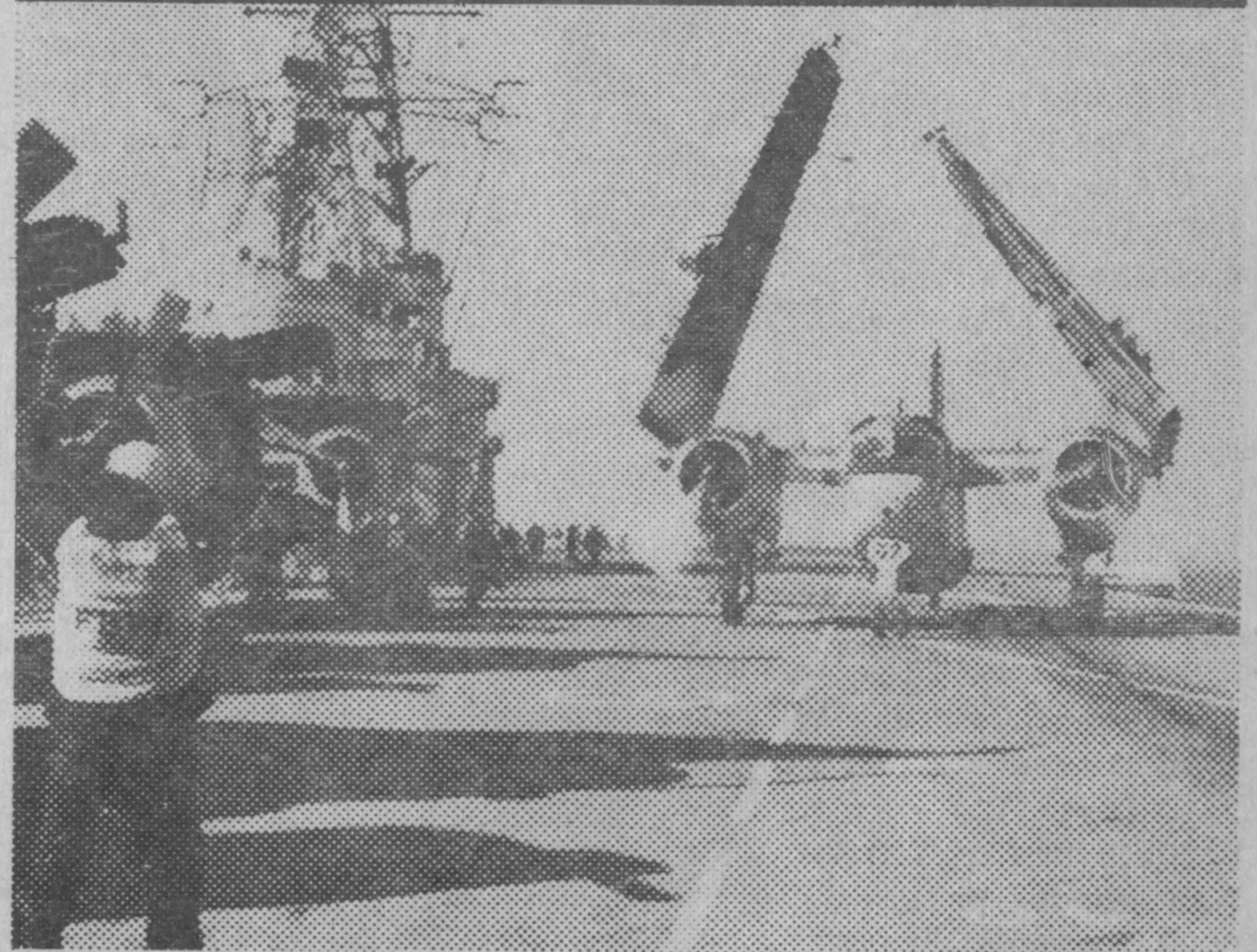
Mrs. R. Fournier, Christian Family Life Convener, reported that the C.W.L. is sponsoring the education of a student native priest in Kandy, Ceylon.
