The material covered tends to be more practical and less theoretical than that of the advanced level. The advanced level, involving more theory, prepares a student to take the subject in grade 13. This accommodates the student who has superior ability in some subjects but average or less than average in others."

As this system requires many more meaningful choices for the student, sound communication among students, parents, teachers and guidance counsellors is essential in order to ensure that wise decisions are made. Students should select those courses which will prepare them best for their elected careers, or, if they are undecided, they should include those courses which keep available the maximum number of opportunities.

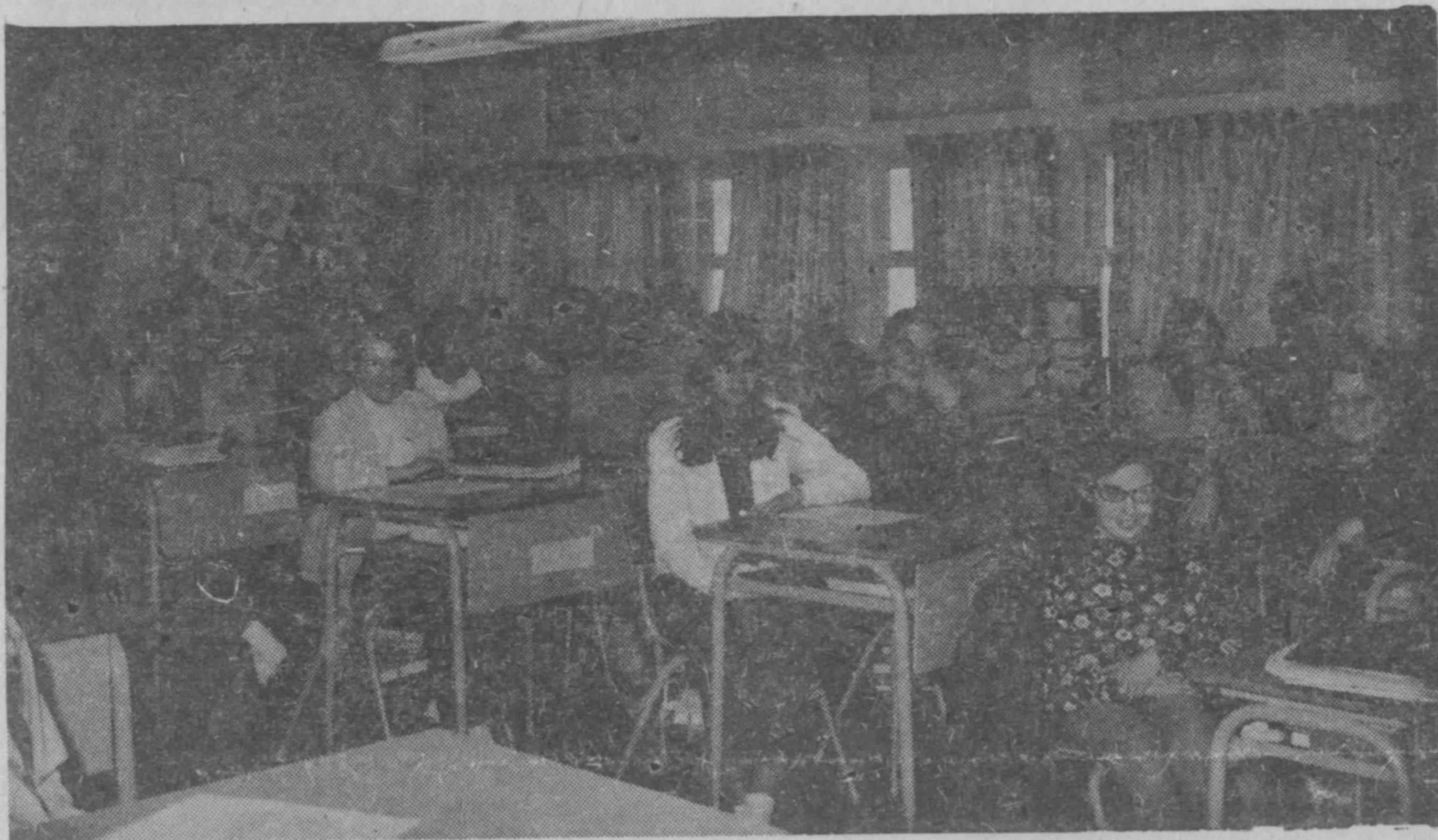
