COMMUNITY CHURCH HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING

The annual Congregational meeting of the Terrace Bay Community Church took place on Sunday evening, preceded by Worship in the Sanctuary at 7 p.m.

Reverend G. Husser called the meeting to order and expressed his gratitude and appreciation to all those who had worked on the various committees and organizations, mentioning especially the young people of the Church.

As is customary, he then called the Chairman and secretary to take over continued next column

at this time. Chairman Peter Vanderkam asked Reverend Husser to open the meeting with prayer. Mrs. Vera Kennedy was asked to act as secretary.

Minutes of the previous congregational meeting were adopted as written.

In the minister's annual report, Mr. Husser stated he would be happy to answer any questions, concerning the report. He said he felt the Under 21 Club should have further discussion, since it seems to be answering a need of teenagers in Terrace Bay, and the club itself was ironing out any difficulties they had.

There are an average of sixty attending, most for the discussion period, and some coming just for the dancing. The Elders had had a meeting to discuss the matter of dancing in the Church basement, but this

was to be brought up under new business

Mrs. Elaine Anderson asked permission to speak, and this was granted. She stated that she felt the religious teachings of the Church in the old format, were not acceptable to the youth of today, hence many of them don't attend Church, and she felt they should not be chastized. She felt a group should be formed with use of the Library for reference, where they could voice opinions freely, and look for new interpretations; discuss the problems openly as to why believe or not believe; a change in music, because she questio ed the wording of many of the old hymr and simply could not accept them. She stated that many believe in religio as a matter of faith, but are confronted with doubts. She said Faith must be a way of living, not adoration.

Reverend Husser agreed that this was concern of everyone, and he commended ed Mrs. Anderson - cont'd page 5
