

## COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met in chambers on February 10th. Road Superintendant John Mikus was commended by Council for the excellent condition of the roads during the recent snowfalls.

Correspondence included a letter from the Minister of Finance and Commercial Affairs concerning lotteries. They submitted information necessary for Council to set up a licensing system.

The Thunder Bay Health Unit stated that Dr. Walker and staff will be in Schreiber and Terrace Bay area on February 23rd. to discuss any problems arising.

The Thunder Bay Home for the Aged requested payment of annual maintenance costs be on a quarter-ly basis.

The Thunder Bay Home for the Aged advised Council regarding additional accommodation, that when all replies are in from the various municipalities they will, at that time, answer any questions that are asked.

The Lake Superior Board of Education advised that new legislation regarding pre-payment of education costs in quarterly payments makes it compulsory.

St. Martin's Separate School requested permission to sell Easter Chocolates the first two weeks in March. Permission granted.

The Fire Department stated there were no fires in January, and the Underwriters Representative made a bi-annual inspection, accompanied by Deputy Fire Chief, E. Stachiw.

By-law 232, supplementary Road Expenditure bylaw in the amount of \$12,000 was submitted for approval to the Department of Highways.

By-law 233 was approved, accepting certain high-ways, streets, blocks and walkways in the new Lake-view Subdivision.
