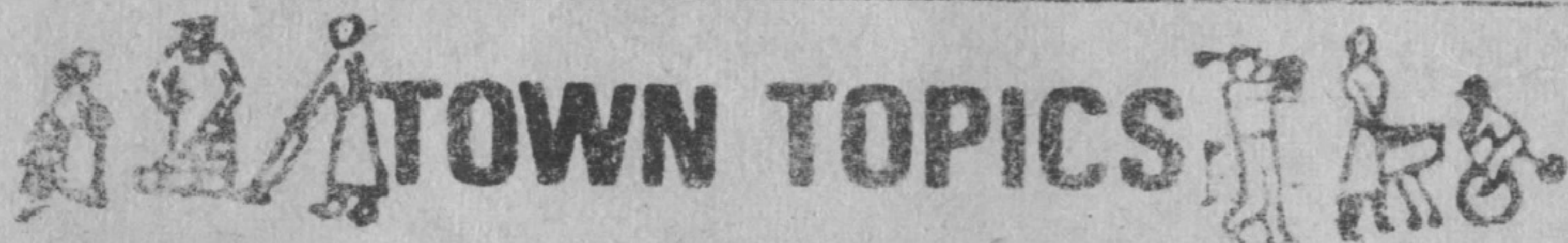

He noted that "in a very practical way you have drawn the litter problem to the attention of hundreds of thousands of people and suggested something they could use to help solve it."

Kimberly Clark has produced a combination tissue dispenser and litter basket for use in automobiles. Since 1966, nearly 60,000 have been distributed to the public.

The Litter-Pickin' Pete Award was established by the Association in 1968 as a means of combatting the growing litter problem along highways and by-ways.

First winner was Coca Cola Limited for its promotion of returnable bottles.

Kimberly Clark of Canada Limited has plants in Saint John, N.B., St. Hyacinthe, Que., Winnipeg Man., and in Kapuskasing, Terrace Bay, St. Catharines, Niagara Falls and Rexdale, Ontario.

A new plant is under construction at Huntsville, Ontario.
