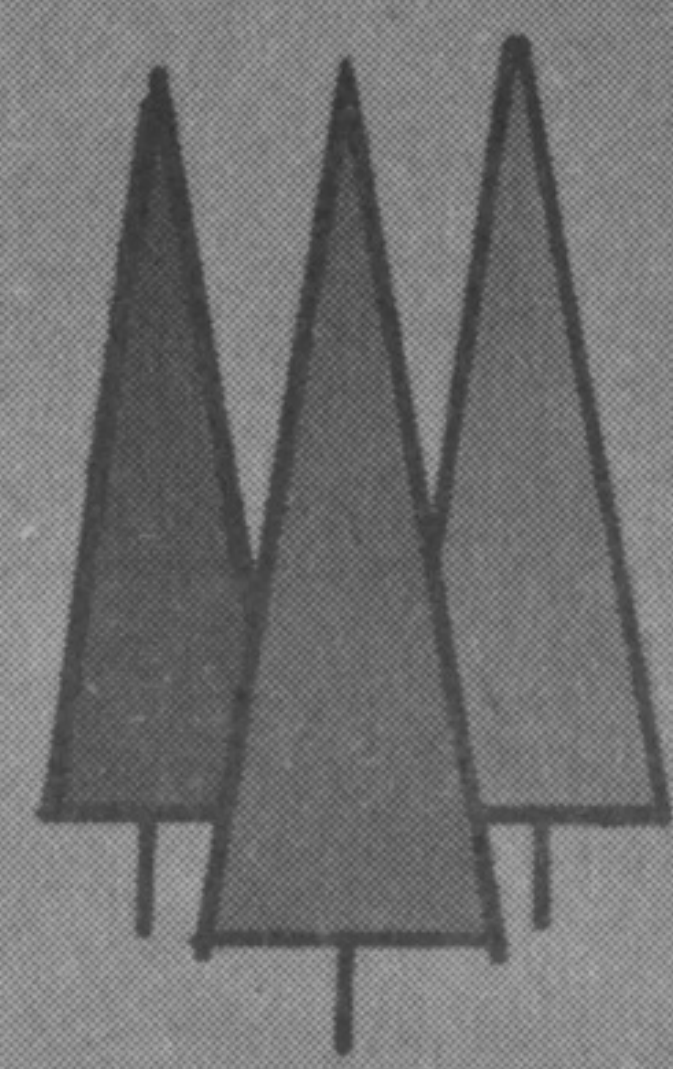

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met on Tuesday evening, in Council chambers and passed the minutes of the previous meeting.

Correspondence included a letter from Captain D. Goodrich of the Salvation Army, Thunder Bay, requesting financial assistance, to carry on their important work. It was pointed out in the reply that the Kimberly Clark Employees Charity Fund makes a yearly donation to the Salvation Army.

The Terrace Bay Ski Club requested permission to solicit support for their upcoming Ski-a-thon, to be held at the Ski Hill on March 8th.

The Ontario Ladies Curling Council wrote a letter of thanks to Council, for the financial assistance they had received during their recent playdowns.

Ontario Hydro requested submission of capital budgets as in previous years for the approval of the Commission.

A letter from the Chief Counsel of Avon Products was received, advising that in their opinion, local representatives do not require licenses under the Transient Traders By-law. They will be advised that the Transient Traders By-law is not in question. However, the Hawkers and Peddlers By-law applies. Council will investigate further.

A Memorandum to all Educational bodies was received, advising that school boards are not to take into account any adjustments for the year 1970, as arrived at by the arbitrators, regarding the assets and liabilities, as December 31, 1968.
