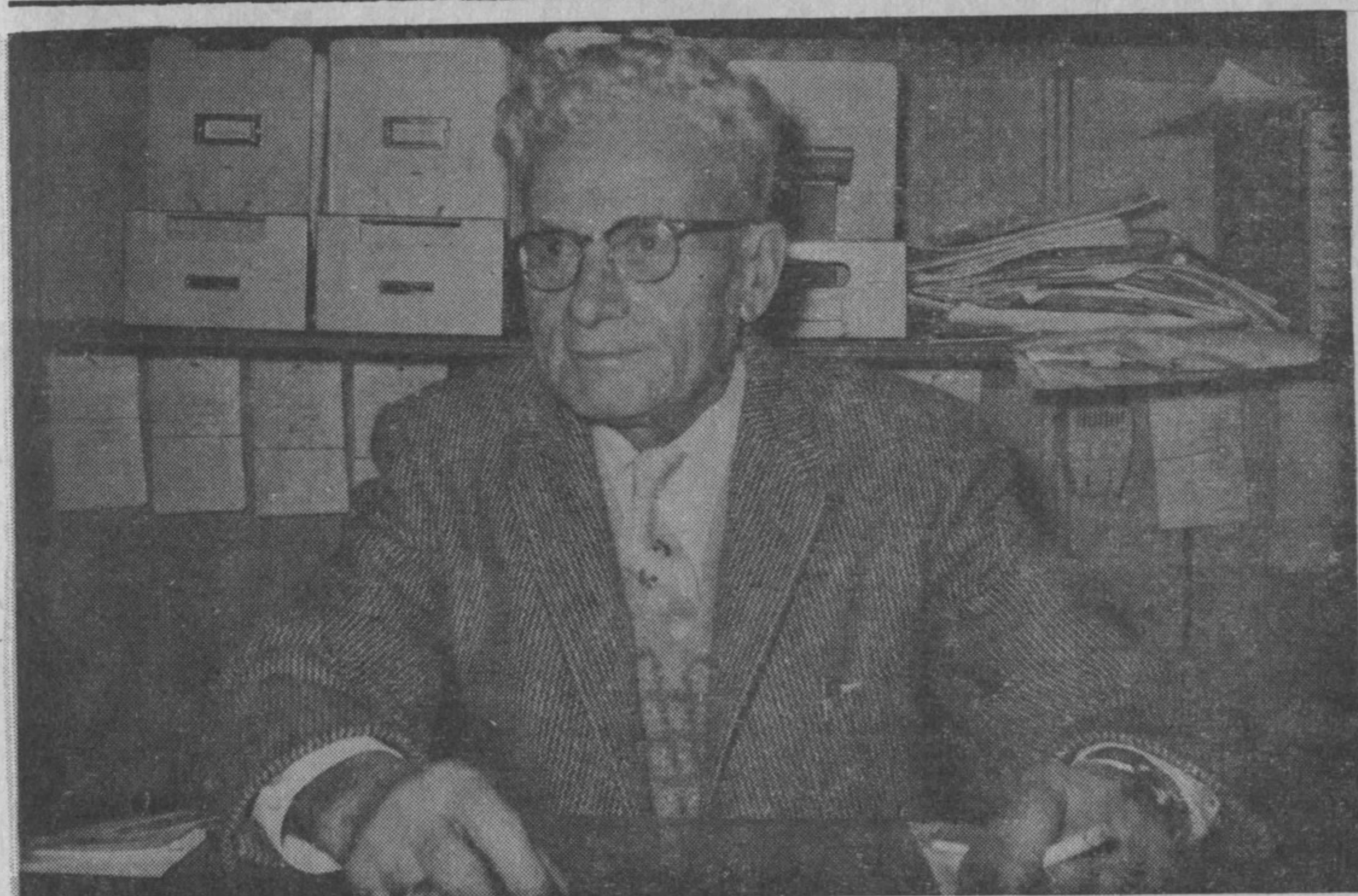

EGINO SPADONI BURIED IN SCHREIBER

Impressive funeral rites were conducted in Holy Angels Roman Catholic Church, Schreiber for the late Eginio (Gino) Spadoni on February 24th.

Mr. Spadoni died in hospital on February 22nd at the age of 84 following a long illness.

Although respected as an astute business man, it was for his other qualities that the entire community paid its last tributes to him. He delighted in sharing in community affairs, by both interest and donations, and despite his own prosperity had a very real compassion for others less fortunate, his kindness according to the need, both impulsive and considered and never a public gesture.
