Some Finance Companies select people who are good credit risks and send them unsolicited invitations to borrow money.

One example (Actually received by an individual goes as follows): -

A promissory note was received with a memo attacht ed reading: "Would \$1,000 be useful at this time? If so, simply sign the enclosed note, mail it in the attached envelope and a cheque will be mailed back to you within 24 hours. Your find credit record enables us to offer this special service. P.S. Retain for future use if not required now."

The promissory note showed the loan to be repaid in 30 instalments of \$41.45, with the cost of borrowing \$243.50, and the annual rate 17.6%, AND LIFE INSURANCE COST \$12.50.


President Keller thanked the two speakers for their reports.
