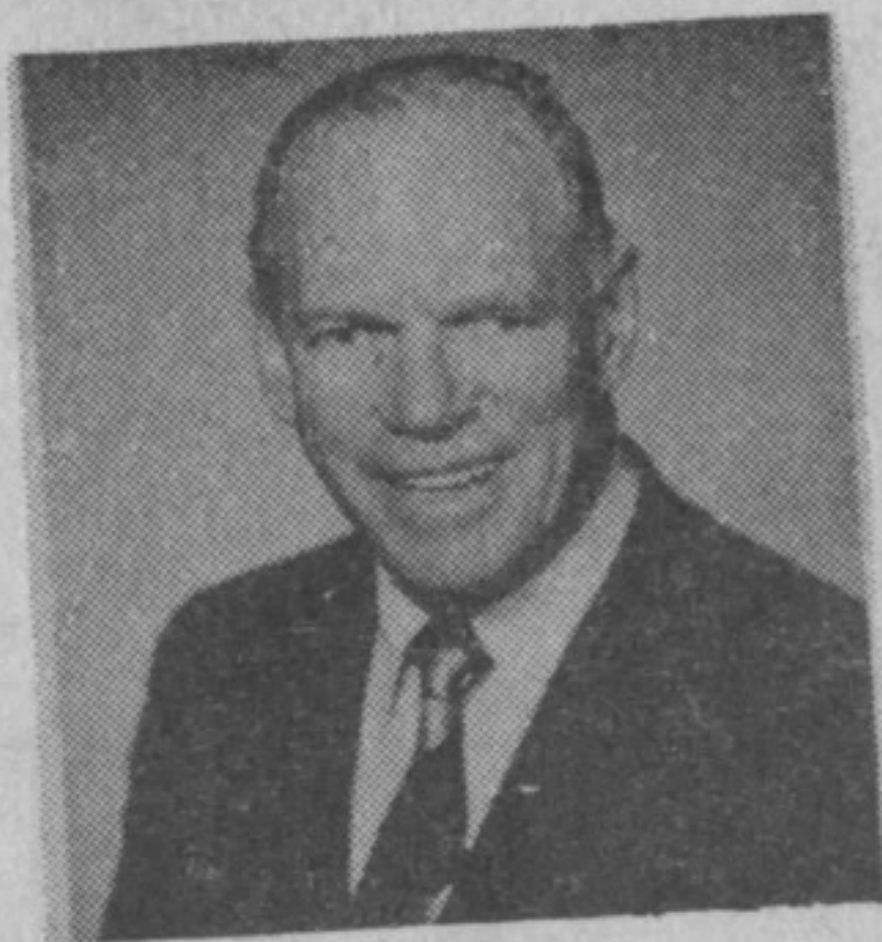

HE IS RISEN MATTHEW 28:6

While we are in the glorious Easter season we would do well to ask ourselves some serious questions. First of all, why did the Lord Jesus have to die the cruel death on the cross?

Christ Himself gives us the answer, He said, "I came to seek and save that which was lost." The second question we should ask ourselves is, who is lost? Isaiah wrote "all we like sheep have gone astray." Paul writes "all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."

Why did Christ die? God ordained it so. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." The wages of sin is death, God gave His Son to die for your sin and mine. Isaiah writes, "the Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all, and with His stripes we are healed."

Peter writes, "who His own self bare our sins in His own body." Christ was taken down from the cross and placed in a tomb which was sealed and guarded. Peter speaks again from the Bible, "Jesus of Nazareth ... whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be holden to it."

The angel declared from the empty tomb, "He is risen." This then is the Easter Message. Christ has defeated sin and death.

One final question. Have you trusted Him as your sin barrier? If not, ask Him to forgive your sins and come into your life. The Bible says, "Whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."
