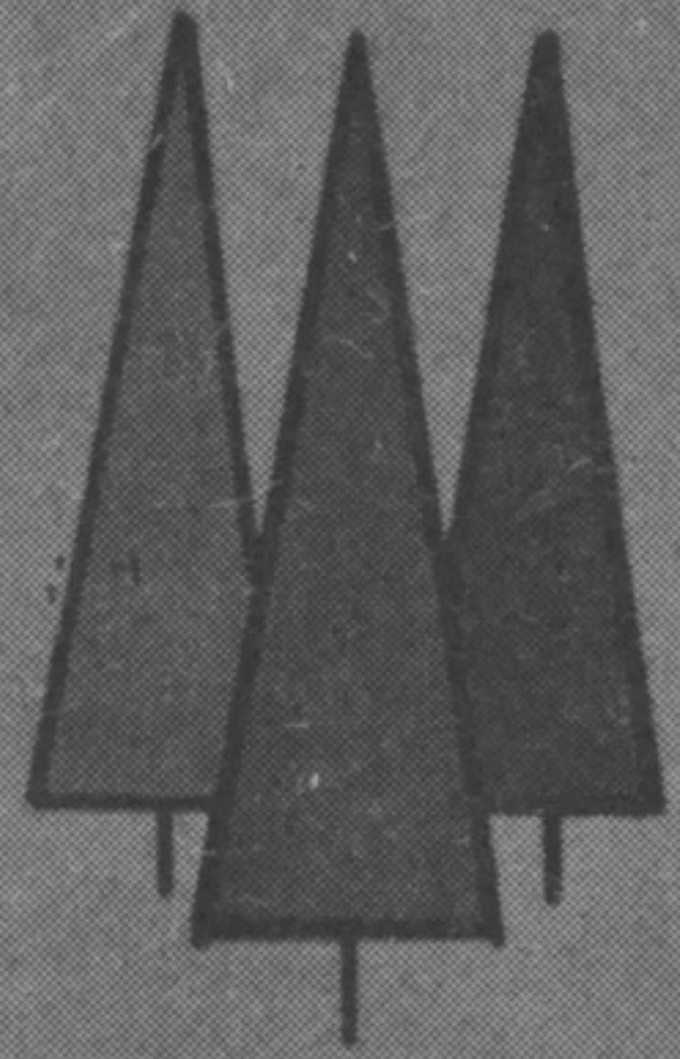
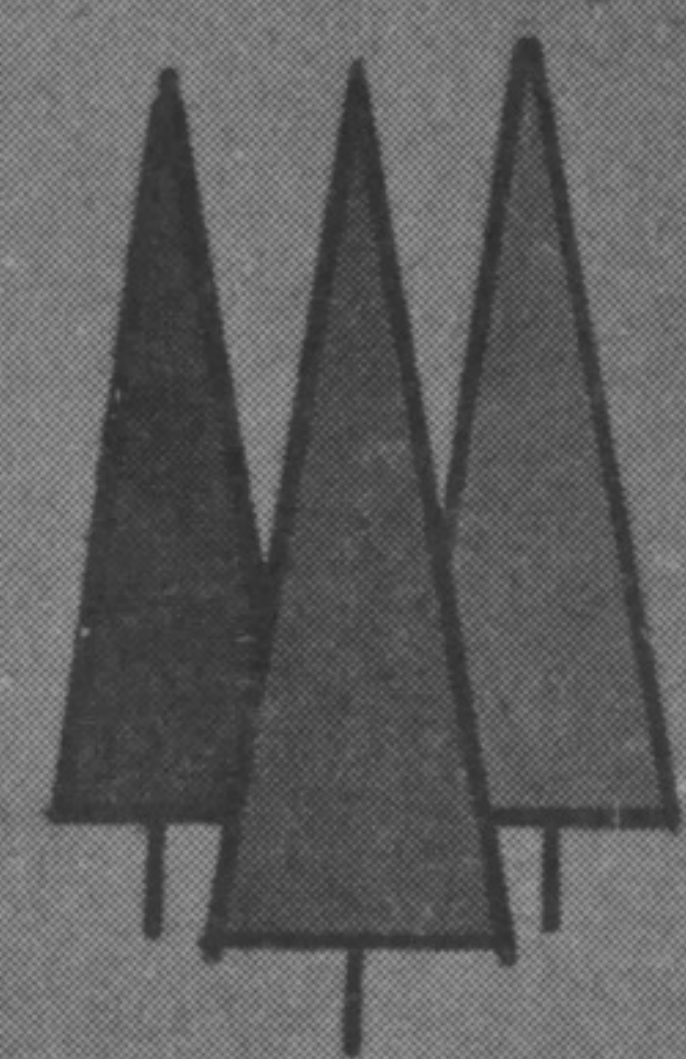

COUNCIL QUOTES

Correspondence was the main item of business when Town Council met in regular session.

A letter was sent to the Department of Financial and Commercial Affairs, regarding the desirability of appointing a Lottery License Officer in Terrace Bay, to regulate Bingo and other lotteries.

The Lake Superior Board of Education asked for clarification on the policy of Daylight Saving Time in Terrace Bay, and were informed that it would take place from April 26 to October 25.

The Quetico Centre advised that due to the large attendance expected, the registration on Regional Government Seminar allotment would be limited to two. Reeve Cavanaugh and Clerk Bill Hanley will attend.

St. Martin's Separate School requested permission to hold a Walkathon, late in April or early May, to raise funds for their forthcoming trip in June, for the Grade 8's. They were advised to seek protection from the proper policing agencies concerned.

The 1970 capital budget has been submitted to the Ontario Hydro Commission for approval.

Township lawyers advised they were proceeding with discussion on the appeal about equalizes assessment, for the District Home for the Aged. They also advised that they were working on a revision to the Hawkers and Peddlers By-law.

A letter was read from the manager of Avon Products re: the Hawkers and Peddlers By-Law, as it affects the local sales persons.

A letter from the Department of Municipal Affairs Assessment Office requested continuance of submitting property sales, building permits, etc., to their office.
