Some nine million tons of waste glass is generated every year in the U.S. A test program has been started to determine if discarded glass can be substituted for such materials as sand, gravel and stone in road building. "Glasphalt" is the result of a University of Missouri ceramic engineering class's research into disposal of discarded bottles. In Toronto the Flintkote Co. on February 25th announced plans to lay a test strip of roadway in Etobicoke, at no cost to the borough, using ground glass as a fill for asphalt.
