government, reporting directly to the regional council through its committees. The regional government also provides a mechanism for new initiatives in public ownership and enterprise.

Proposals for regional government are applicable throughout Ontario. They have a particular relevance for northern Ontario, where the absence of effective local government in vast areas has contributed to overall economic disadvantages."

He concluded his speech by enumerating a summary of nine proposals, as follows: -

A new Department of Regional and Local Government to be responsible for the planning of local government functions, finances and structures.

An over-all provincial land use and transportation plan.

The creation of regional governments, capable of greater responsibility and autonomy, with a full elected council assuming direct responsibility of all agencies, commissions and authorities operating in the municipal public sector in the region.

The inclusion of education as a responsibility of the regional council and the replacement of boards of education by an education committee of the council, including councillors, teachers and students. continued page 15
