LEGION ZONE PLANS FINALIZED FOR CELEBRATION OF 25th ANN.

Details as to time etc. have now been announced by Marathon Branch No. 183 of the Royal Canadian Legion for the Zone 82 observance of the 25th anniversary of V.E. Day. The celebrations will take place Saturday, May 9, rather on May 8, so that it will be convenient for more veterans to take part.
