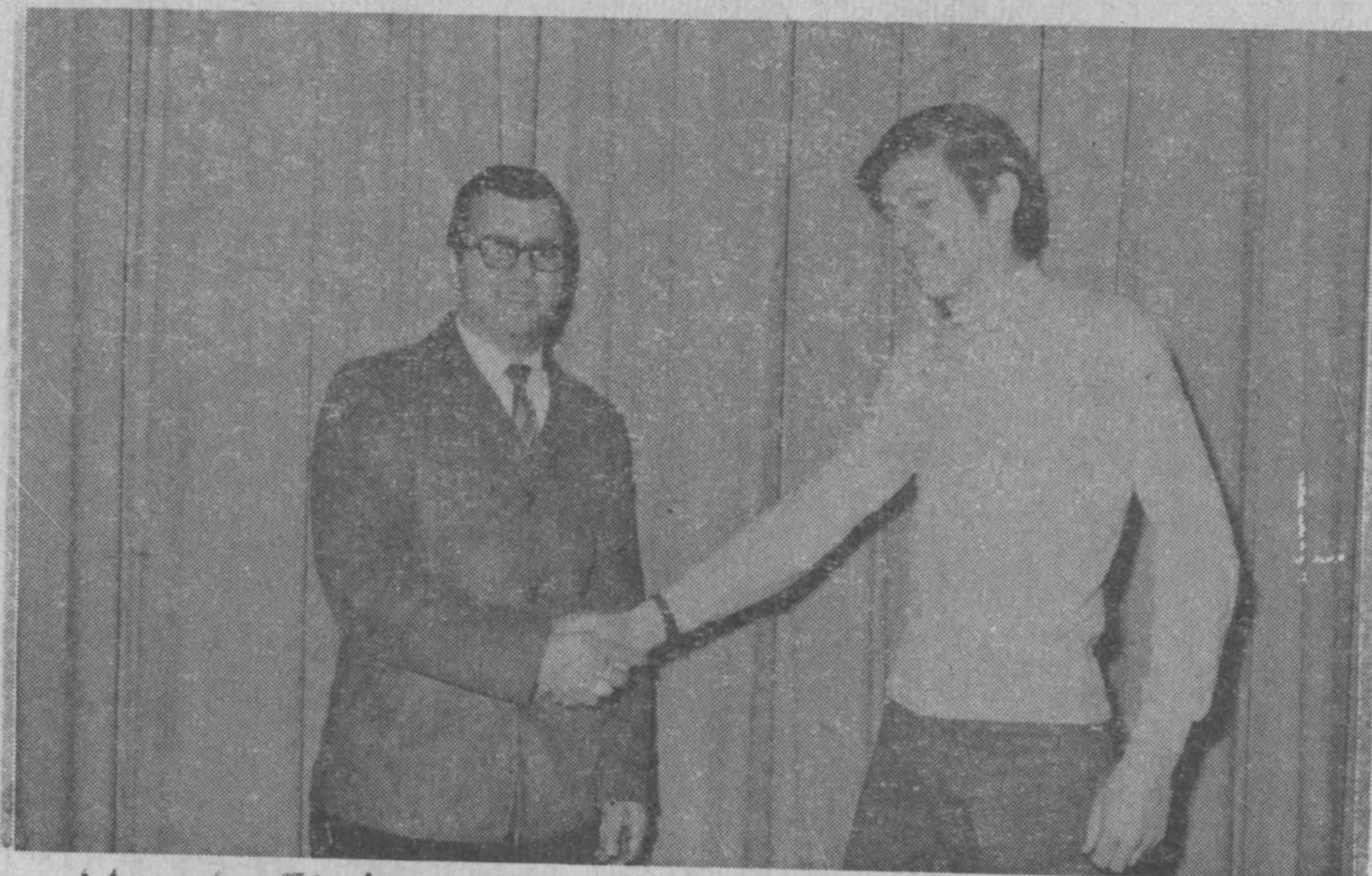
**SCHREIBER "KIN" CORNER**  
LEADERSHIP COURSE

The Kin Hi ninth annual leadership course will be held at Quetico Centre in August. Once again the Kinsmen Club of Schreiber will sponsor a student from Schreiber High School School.

John McGrath, presently in grade 10, will attend this course which is designed: to develop insight into democratic leadership; to understand society demands on a citizen; and to create awareness of one's own potential for growth.
