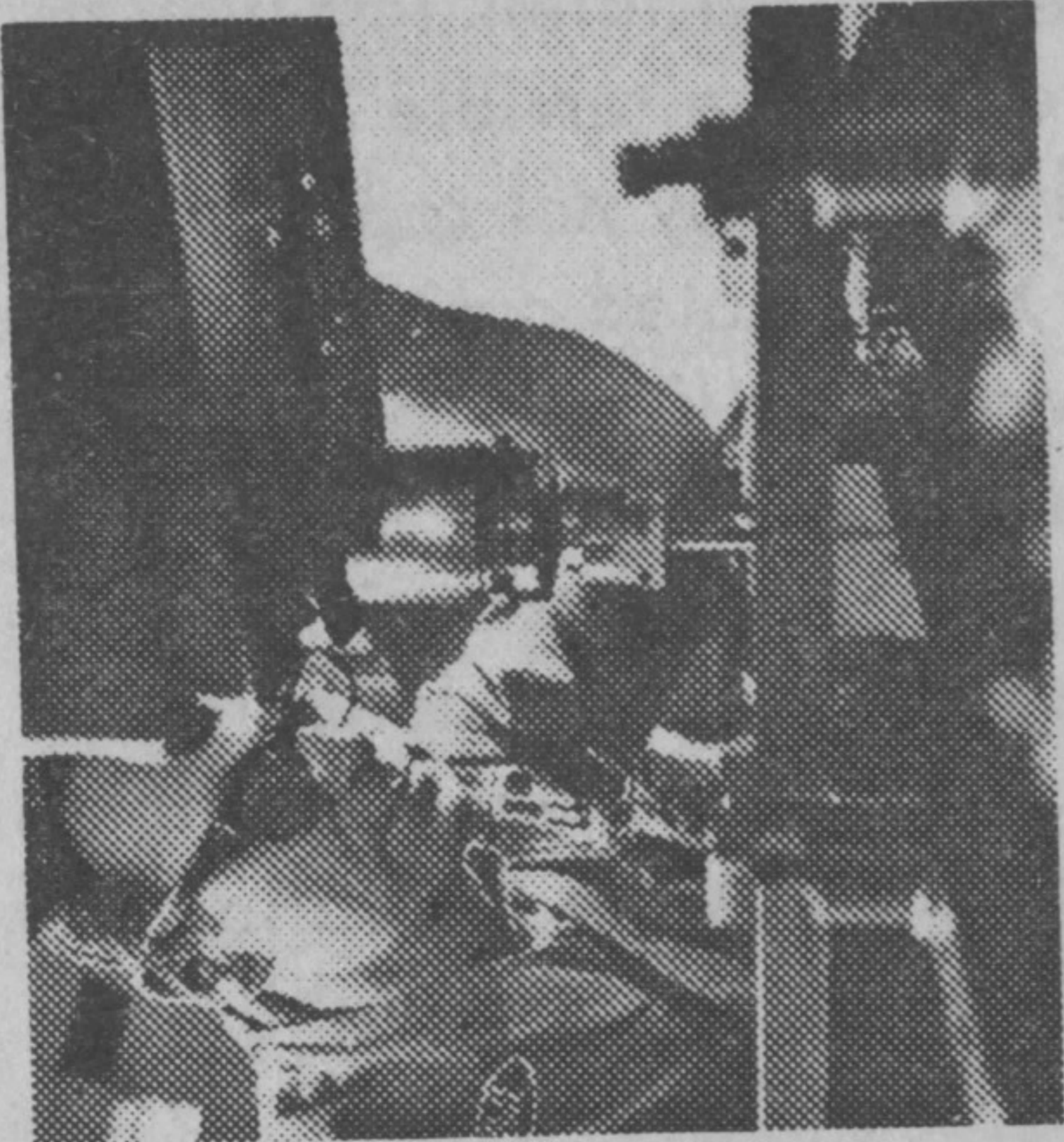


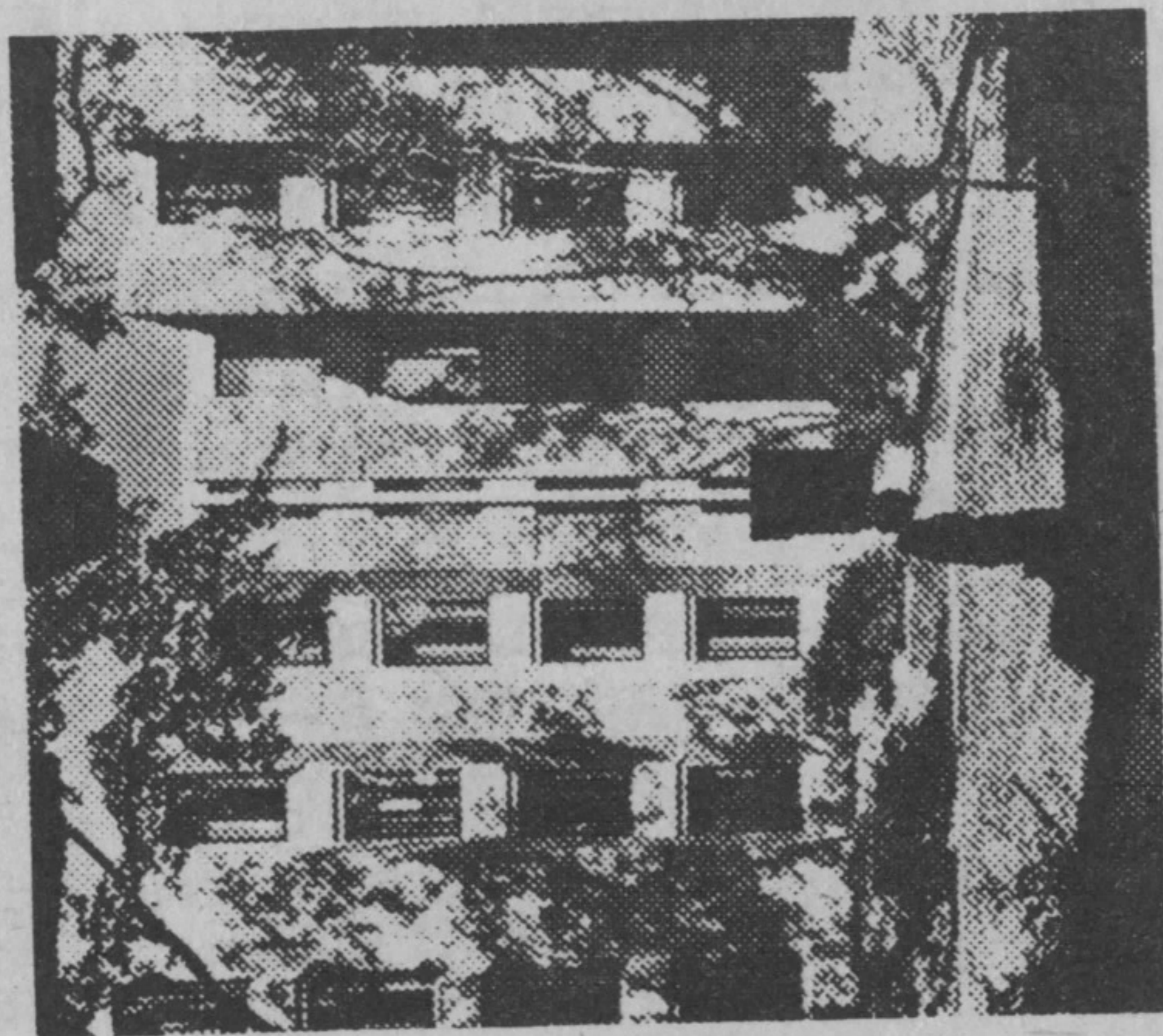

Recent announcements from the office of Keith Penner, Member of Parliament for Thunder Bay District are that Our Lady of Fatima School in Longlac, Ontario has been awarded \$1,000 by the Citizenship Branch of the Secretary of State's Department.

This grant is given in support of project "School Travel Group to Quebec City". It will allow sixty students to spend ten days with Quebec families. On their way they will visit Ottawa, tour the Parliament Buildings and meet with their Member of Parliament and that the Ecole St. Joseph in Geraldton has been awarded a travel and exchange grant in the amount of \$2,000 by the Citizenship Branch of the Department of the Secretary of State.

The grant was given in support of "Voyage au Quebec" which will allow seventy participants to visit Ottawa and Montral in June 1970.

They will be hosted by Quebec families where there will be exchange of ideas on the bilingual and cultural aspect of the country.
