The regular meeting of the Library Board of Trustees was held Saturday, May 9, 1970. Present were Mrs. J. Turner, Mrs. R. McGrath, chairman, Mrs. N. McGuire, and Sec.-Treas. Miss G. Hadley and Librarian Mrs. A. Hill.

The Sec.-Treas. presented the audited financial report for 1969. The board employed a librarian for fifteen hours a week for twelve months and a student assistant part time for six months. The sum of \$1,253.91 was spent on the purchase of books for the permanent collection while only \$19.30 was spent on periodicals: \$592.65 was spent on shelving and file
